Prayer for those seeking sanctuary

Lord Jesus, we pray for those members of God's family who come here to escape oppression, poverty, persecution, violence, and war. Ramblings As we approach Holy Week, we are called to ponder the scripture readings. Ronald Rolheiser suggests that to ponder is not to reflect, nor look for words or understanding - even knowledge about the readings is not helpful. Pondering involves putting ourselves into a helpless situation; a situation over which we have no power to help or change. Pondering asks us to join someone in their hopeless situation and be present to their helplessness and become vulnerable and helpless with them. We cannot take away another's pain and nor should, we but we can accompany them and let them know that they are not alone.

There is a story about a mother who lost her child at a very early age and was inconsolable. She was sitting in a room surrounded by friends and family in a grief that was palpable when another friend came into the room and sat next to her. She put her arm round the mother and began to cry with her. She stayed for about ten minutes sharing the tears after which she stood up and left - no word spoken. As she left, it seemed that the heavy grief in the room became less heavy.

Let us ponder the readings this week which prepare us to walk with Jesus through his passion and death, not trying to work it all out or even to understand all the whys and wherefores. Instead ponder the journey Jesus is taking accompany him. By making this journey in this way you be more open to and develop an empathy with Jesus and his helplessness. Thus, you will come closer to Jesus and Jesus will come closer to you.

Then, maybe, just maybe, by being with Jesus in this way, you may well have helped him face his sufferings and passion and help him fulfil his mission of love knowing he was not alone!
