Ramblings On a Sunday when we focus on the mercy of God and recognise that mercy as one of the great symbols of God's love for us, we, too, want to exclaim with St Thomas "My Lord and my God!" As so often happens, the gospel helps us recognise that the deepest faith is often found in those who have lived through a period of great spiritual darkness, times of doubt and unbelief in which God seemed absent.

There is an element of doubt in all our believing that challenges our faith. We all live lives that can experience times of darkness and a sense of loss and dislocation from God when we feel God is distant, even absent from our lives. Fortunately, there are also times when God's presence seems very real and tangible when our faith is strong, uplifting and supportive. However, some people seem to have a much stronger experience of spiritual darkness than others. It is good therefore to have St Thomas show us that times of disturbing and isolating religious doubt can be the prelude to a deeply rooted and richly expressed faith hidden deep within.

Jesus offers us, and all those who have not lived and seen Jesus, words of reassurance by saying 'Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe'. Jesus acknowledges that our faith is every bit as genuine as the faith of the original eyewitnesses, those who saw and believed, revealing once again the power and strength of the mercy and love of God for us!

Repairs to church heating update The source of the fault with the heating to the church is a leaky pipe between the boiler and the church. This has been identified as lying under the tarmac of the car park between the boiler room in the hall kitchen and the corner of the church. The means digging that area of the car park. Work will start on Monday 15th April and hopefully not take longer than 3-4 days. It will not be possible to enter the church nor the hall via the ramp side of the porch. You are advised to go around to the front road entrance and up the steps. We are sorry for the inconvenience but the upside will be that we will have a warm church again.

Car park space will be limited The bays in front of the kitchen and along the church wall will be needed for contractors equipment and to allow space to dig the trench.

Inside the Church the Sacred Heart alcove and aisle to it from the main door, and the aisle along the north wall will be cordoned off to allow access to the pipework entry into the church please use the other side of the church for mass and services. Thanks in anticipation of your patience.
