Encourage the children to share what they know about sheep and shepherds.

A good shepherd knows each of his sheep by name.

Have the children talk about how they got their names: who chose them? Have the children say who has called them by name in the past week, and why.

Today's Gospel story is about a special shepherd and special sheep.

WELCOME AND PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL

Say/sing logether:

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the good shepherd, says Jesus.

I know my sheep and
they know me.

Alleluia!

A reading from the Good News given to us by John. Glory to you, Lord.

Jesus says,
I am the good shepherd.
I know my sheep and they know me.
They follow me
because they know my voice.
The shepherd comes in to the
sheepfold by the gate,
but the thief who comes to kill and

destroy

sneaks in through a hole in the wall.


If a wolf attacks my sheep,

DISCUSSION

Encourage the children to describe in their own words what Jesus says about caring for sheep.

Jesus wants us to follow him, like sheep follow the shepherd. Have the children give examples of following Jesus. Some people follow Jesus by becoming priests, sisters, missionaries.

ACTIVITIES

- > Give out the cut-out shapes and have the children write or draw how they will respond when their name is called in the week ahead, e.g. at bed-time, at meals, etc.
- > Game:
 - form a circle:
 - choose one child to be Jesus;
 three or four to be thieves outside
 the circle; two to be the gateway;
 some children to be sheep within
- the circle; the rest form the circle;
 Jesus and the 'thieves' take turns
 to call 'sheep' from the circle by
 name. The 'sheep' have to listen
 carefully and only leave when
 'lesus' calls.
- > Recite this prayer together: Lord Jesus, our loving shepherd, help us to hear you always and to say 'yes' when you call our names.
