Parish Jubilee prayer - Pilgrims of Hope

Father in heaven, may our faith in you reawaken in us hope for the coming of your Kingdom. May your grace transform us! May the gospel recreate, in us and the cosmos, a new heaven and a new earth. Vanquish the powers of Evil so that your glory will shine eternally. May the graces of the Jubilee reawaken in us, Pilgrims of Hope, a desire to spread joy and peace throughout the earth. To you be glory and praise for ever. Amen.

Ramblings Like Isaiah we can sometimes be overcome by the power and presence of God that we feel unworthy of the experience, yet still feel grateful like Isaiah. This is why we greet the eucharist with the words "Lord, I am not worthy to receive you under my roof ..." Today Jesus reveals the power and generosity of God and identifies the special place Jesus gave to his disciples.

Once a professor gave a balloon to every student, who had to inflate it, write their name on it and throw it in the hallway. The professor then mixed all the hundreds of balloons. The students were given 5 minutes to find their own balloon. Despite a hectic search, no one found their balloon. At that point the professor told the students to take the first balloon that they found and hand it to the person whose name was written on it. Within 5 minutes everyone had their own balloon.

The professor said to the students: "These balloons are like happiness. We will never find happiness if everyone is looking for their own. But, if we care about other people's happiness, we'll find ours too!!"

By working together we will achieve much more than if each of us works alone. By sharing our journey with others, although individually we are like a single unique balloon among many others; when we join together, we can soar into far greater heights than we ever could on our own.

Jesus obviously wanted a synodal church from the beginning i.e. a church that actively encourages participation and dialogue among all its members, where everyone is invited to listen to one another. share their perspectives, and work together to discern God's will on important issues, essentially "journeying together with Jubilee hope" As a community we make decisions as the People of God focusing on communion, participation, and mission, while listening and including the different demographics within the church.
