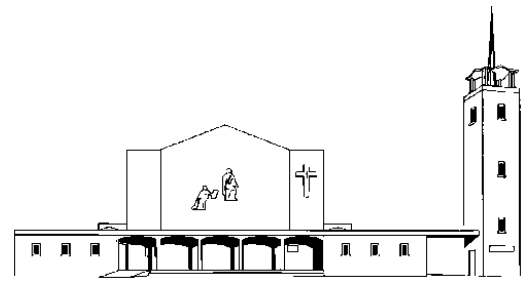

GOSPEL: Matthew 11: 2–11

Are you the one who is to come, or have we got to wait for someone else?

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

'GAUDETE* SUNDAY' — WITH ROSE-COLOURED VESTMENTS — MARKS OUR MID-POINT OF ADVENT, as we come closer towards the joyful celebration of the Birth of Our Lord. (* 'Gaudete' means 'rejoice'!)

As Catholics, we should set a good example in speaking of the season's true meaning to those around us. We should make sure that the secular elements of Christmas — our preparations of food, drink, journeys and presents — do not obscure the fact that this is a Christian feast, with a world-changing meaning, namely the human birth of the eternal Son of God. Let's be sure to place the spiritual elements of Christmas above all else. An obvious example would be to make sure that *we only send Christmas cards that have a religious theme*, i.e. the Nativity of Our Lord. Please, as Catholics, we must be seen to do this. I urge you strongly to spread the Gospel in this simple, but powerful way. Christmas is about Christ, and we must proclaim this!

IN THE GOSPEL TODAY, FOR A SECOND WEEK RUNNING, we hear of St John the Baptist, who 'prepared the way for the Lord.' He called the people to repentance, and made sure his own followers knew that Jesus was definitely "the One who was to come." As I said in the homily last weekend, we should heed John's call to seek forgiveness for our sins. So, please note the times for the parish **Penitential Services with Confession on Monday**, so that you can come and receive the Sacrament of Forgiveness, and prepare the way, in your hearts, for Christ to come to you at Christmas in a heart cleansed of sin. Here are some key ways to prepare for Christmas:

Sunday 15th December 5pm. Holy Hour. Adoration, Evening Prayer & Benediction.

Monday 16th December 11.30am & 7.30pm. Penitential Services with Confession.

Sunday 22nd December 5pm. Parish Carol Service with readings and carols.

As we keep our joyful 'Gaudete' Sunday today, I do hope and pray that you can all enter peacefully into the remaining 10 days before Christmas, and despite all your preparations, be truly of a Christian heart and mind, placing the divine Lord Jesus at the centre.

May God bless us with the joy and hope of our Advent season of expectation!

Although the world of today has a very vivid awareness of its unity and of how one man depends on another in needful solidarity, it is most grievously torn into opposing camps by conflicting forces.
