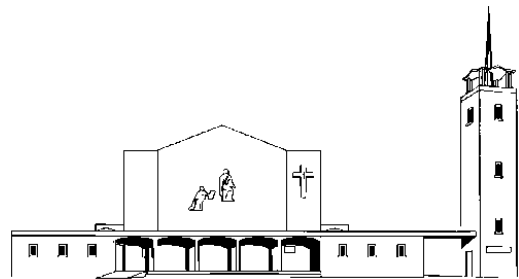

GOSPEL: Matthew 14: 22-33

Tell me to come to you across the water.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

This Sunday's Gospel calls upon us to have confidence in Jesus Christ our Saviour. You can go through the worst that life can throw at you, just think of all the things we are worried about: parents worried about their children, people worried about their health or that of others, farmers worrying about the weather or their livestock, financial worries, worries about relationships, worries about so many different things, survival in developing countries like Uganda. If only you keep up your contact with God in prayer, you will be rescued. The moment you take your eyes off of Jesus, just like Peter, you will sink. Soon, you will only be able to hear the screaming wind, the awful noise, and the roar of the storms and winds that shake the very foundations of your life.

Does the Lord seem distant when trials or adversity come your way? Do you look for the Lord's presence when you encounter difficulties or challenges? The Lord keeps watch over us at all times and especially in our moments of temptation and difficulty. Jesus assures us that we have no need of fear if we trust in Him and in his great love for us. When calamities or trials threaten to overwhelm us with confidence, we should call upon Jesus to save us.

The disciples in the boat in today's Gospel were frightened by the storm; they called upon Jesus to come to their rescue. Indeed, Jesus came to their aid. Courage! It is I! Do not be afraid. Therefore, when we are worried, let us turn to Jesus and continue to trust in him, he will certainly save us.

Farewell to all of you and thank you for making me feel so welcome and showering me with your love. Our parish's **Growing in Faith** season has run from January–Easter, giving us the chance, along with all Westminster Catholics, to support the needs of the local Church.

So far we have received committed pledges of **£173,000** (£42,000 for parish), but there are still parishioners who have indicated that they wish to give, but have not yet filled in pledge forms. I urge that they do so at the earliest opportunity in order for us to be sure of reaching our target, so we can move on to seeking an employee with confidence.

Our local parish project is a very important one: to employ a part-time parish catechist to add to the great work already going on at St Augustine's in First Holy Communion and Confirmation, RCIA etc. by wonderful volunteers. There are so many other opportunities for catechesis and work amongst the youth & young adults of our parish which we could begin through a new employee. **PLEASE PRAY that the right person can now be sought.**

FEAST OF THE WEEK

Assumption of Our

Lady – 15th August

On November 1st 1950, Pius XII defined the dogma of the Assumption. Thus, he solemnly proclaimed that the belief whereby the Blessed Virgin Mary, at the close of her earthly life, was taken up, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, definitively forms part of the deposit of faith, received from the Apostles. To avoid all that is uncertain, the Pope did not state either the manner or the circumstances of time and place in which the Assumption took place – only the fact of the Assumption of Mary, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, is the matter of the definition.
