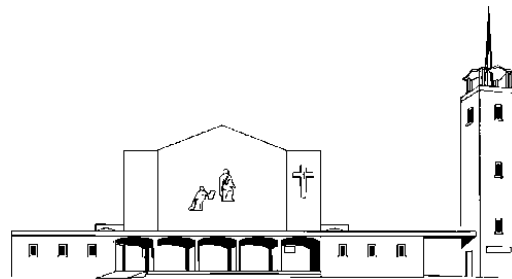

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THIS SUNDAY'S GOSPEL FOCUSES ON THE KINGDOM OF GOD

Jesus referred to the Kingdom of God as a hidden treasure, a box filled with golden coins buried somewhere in a field. Likewise, He spoke of the Kingdom as a precious pearl, a jewel found by a businessman who astutely sold everything he owned in order to buy it. He spoke too of the Kingdom as fishing net filled with fish both good and bad. Later, He referred to the Kingdom as leaven in dough, as light, salt and seed. Likewise, He called it a ripe harvest, a royal feast and a wedding banquet.

What is the kingdom of God for us in our everyday terms, as we live our lives here in the world? How do we identify and describe God's kingdom here on earth? Some think of the Kingdom as a remote and distant heaven in another world at the end of life. Others think it's an ideal political and economic order. Some think that the Kingdom is exclusively God's business, not ours, and we have only to wait and receive it from God's hands. Some identify the Kingdom as the Church, what's inside the Church is the Kingdom, what's outside the Church is not part of God's Kingdom.

God's Kingdom is God's desire for human life, the expression of His will that your life, and those who live in your life, might be filled with His joy, His love, His mercy, His justice, His truth and His peace. In God's kingdom there is joy and happiness as expressed in the Lord's prayer.

Jesus was recognised as the Son of God because those around Him were filled with joy, newness of life as demonstrated in His miracles, signs of the arrival and reign of God's kingdom.

People should enjoy good life in God's kingdom and so Jesus cried: "Stop being deaf! That's no good. Hear! Stop being blind! That's no good. See! Stop being crippled. That's no good. Move! Stop being mute. That's no good. Speak!" The kingdom of God is within your reach, embrace it and you will have good life. I have come to give them life abundantly.

GRATITUDE: I am grateful to Fr Philip for having invited me to cover him while on holiday and to all you dear friends for your warm welcome, kindness and hospitality. May God reward you abundantly.

Our parish's **Growing in Faith** season has run from January–Easter, giving us the chance, along with all Westminster Catholics, to support the needs of the local Church.
