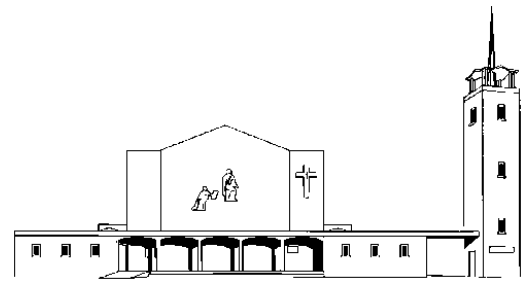

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

9th MARCH 2014

GOSPEL: Matthew 4: 1–11

Jesus fasts for forty days and is tempted.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

OUR JOURNEY TO EASTER HAS BEGUN, WITH LENT'S START ON ASH WEDNESDAY. Our Lord's 40 days in the wilderness — days of fasting and prayer, and resistance to the devil's temptations — we hear of in today's Gospel passage. And it is these 40 days which we imitate in our own fast of Lent. We should engage with this season by fasting, prayer and almsgiving, and take this seriously as a time to grow closer to the Lord. The better we keep Lent, the better we will be ready for the joyous celebration of Easter!



Last weekend we heard the Cardinal talk about the Pope's recent document, *Evangelii Gaudium* ("The Joy of the Gospel"). In the coming weeks, we will be able to sample his teaching through a series of inserts (purple pages). These will take us through the Sunday Gospels for Lent and connect them with the desire of the Pope that we manifest the joy of the Gospel and be the Lord's active, willing, faithful "missionary disciples," taking the Gospel joyfully to others.

OUR GROWING IN FAITH CAMPAIGN — our parish's contribution to the diocesan scheme to support our parishes, our priests, and our diocesan *Caritas* (caring for the poor and needy) — has now reached a crucial stage, and within the next week or so, I will be widening its reach, so that everyone who has not yet had a chance to hear about it one-to-one will be able to. As a part of this, I invite everyone in the parish to come and meet our auxiliary bishop in Hertfordshire,

He will come and address an open meeting of the parish in the crypt, and explain further about the *Growing in Faith* campaign and give us all the opportunity to ask questions and consider giving to the scheme. Drinks and nibbles will be provided so we can mingle and chat with the bishop afterwards. Please let's show our unity as a parish in coming to meet Bishop Sherrington this Wed.

May God bless us this week and may Our Lady's prayers help us to be holy.

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 14:



Though made of body and soul, man is one. Through his bodily composition he gathers to himself the elements of the material world; thus they reach their crown through him, and through him raise their voice in free praise of the Creator. For this reason man is not allowed to despise his bodily life, rather he is obliged to regard his body as good and honourable since God has created it and will raise it up on the last day. Nevertheless, wounded by sin, man experiences rebellious stirrings in his body. But the very dignity of man postulates that man glorify God in his body and forbid it to serve the evil inclinations of his heart.

PARISH "PENANCE" FOR LENT: in Lent, we will have no final hymn at Sunday Mass, and then we will **keep silence** in the body of the church, so as to allow a period of prayer for those who wish to remain after Mass in Thanksgiving. Please abide by this!

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: the "Way of the Cross" followed in church each Friday (12.30pm, after Mass) & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass.) Stations of the Cross in Italian each Friday at 5pm.

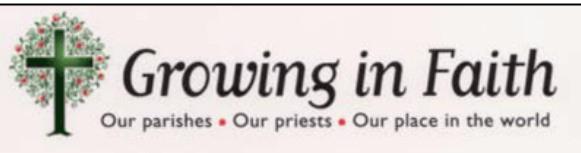
HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS
