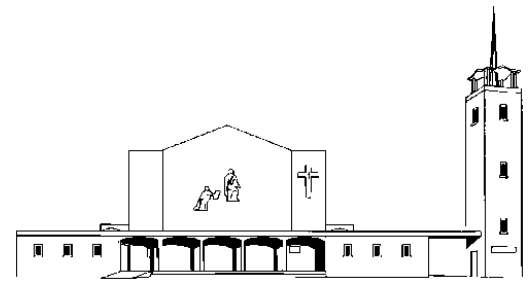

Year A DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA

9TH NOV 2014

GOSPEL: John 2: 13–22

He was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THIS WEEKEND WE KEEP THE FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA, the feast day for the 9th November. The reason for the solemnity of this occasion — and its taking precedence over the '32nd Sunday' — is that this church in Rome is the *cathedral*



of the Pope, and therefore this feast is a celebration of the unity of the whole Catholic Church with the Holy See. For this reason, on the front of the Lateran Basilica are written the words, "Head

and Mother of all the churches of the City (i.e. Rome) and the World." We recognise the Pope as the successor of St Peter, in his primacy amongst the apostles, the "rock" on whom Jesus has built His Church. We hold firm to the Holy See as the 'anchor point' of our faith, knowing that God has given us the papacy as the sign and focus of our communion. As we keep this celebration, our prayers are for the Pope himself, and for all that the Vatican does to promote the Gospel throughout the world and keep the disciples of Jesus together, "one Church, to proclaim one Lord."



WE EXTEND OUR SYMPATHIES to the Byrne family on the sudden death this week of Vincent, who has lived in this parish all his life. The Byrne family occupied the Lodge house which was on the front of the church property in the years before the church was built, when Esdaile House was the home of the Augustinian 'Canons of the Lateran.' Vincent has been intimately involved in the life of our parish, therefore, his whole life long. *May he rest in peace.*

AS OF THIS WEEKEND, THE ITALIAN MASS has moved to Saturday afternoon (4pm). Note that it remains a Sunday-Mass celebration, fulfilling the obligation for attending Sunday Mass. Please inform anyone who may have missed this notification.

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 35:



Human activity, to be sure, takes its significance from its relationship to man. Just as it proceeds from man, so it is ordered toward man. For when a man works he not only alters things and society, he develops himself as well. He learns much, he cultivates his resources, he goes outside of himself and beyond himself. Rightly understood this kind of

growth is of greater value than any external riches which can be garnered. A man is more precious for what he is than for what he has. Similarly, all that men do to obtain greater justice, wider brotherhood, a more humane disposition of social relationships has greater worth than technical advances. For these advances can supply the material for human progress, but of themselves alone they can never actually bring it about.
