

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE MONTH OF OCTOBER IS DEDICATED IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH TO THE MOST HOLY ROSARY. As well as offering a decade of the Rosary prior to each of the Sunday Masses, we will sing a Marian hymn at the end of those Masses too. This brings to our attention the power and importance of the intercession of Our Blessed Lady. She who was chosen above all others to be the Mother of the Lord, is undeniably a great aid for us each in our Christian journey. She who knows and loves God better than any one of us, can be the most blessed guide for us. With her maternal instinct, she cares for us and protects us, urging us constantly to keep to the path that Christ has mapped out for us. Sharing in the venerable prayer of the Rosary is a way of tuning into the blessed example of Mary in the life of Christ. Reflecting on the 20 Mysteries of the Holy Rosary allow us to be enveloped in the sacred events of our salvation. We need this continued return to enshrine life's events and decisions in the context of our faith. Praying the Rosary helps us to do that. Our life should mirror that of Our Lady's: loving God, offering our lives to Him, striving to be holy. As wife and mother she can help us daily to be better Christians.

If you need to be reminded of the prayers and structure of the Rosary, then purchase a copy of the rosary card (30p) available in the CTS racks at each end of the church porch. It is important that, as Catholics, we take up our rosaries and make use of them. They are not for decoration, but for prayer! The Rosary is an ideal prayer also for the home, so I do urge families to consider a return to this devout practice. Even a single decade at a time is a powerful opportunity to offer that sacrifice of time to God in union with His Blessed Mother.

Our Lady of the Most Holy Rosary — Mother of God — pray for our parish!

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 32:



As God did not create man for life in isolation, but for the formation of social unity, so also "it has pleased God to make men holy and save them not merely as individuals, without bond or link between them, but by making them into a single people, a people which acknowledges Him in truth and serves Him in holiness." So from the beginning of salvation

history He has chosen men not just as individuals but as members of a certain community. Revealing His mind to them, God called these chosen ones "His people," and even made a covenant with them on Sinai.

This communitarian character is developed and consummated in the work of Jesus Christ. For the very Word made flesh willed to share in the human fellowship. He was present at the wedding of Cana, visited the house of Zacchaeus, ate with publicans and sinners. He revealed the love of the Father and the sublime vocation of man in terms of the most common of social realities and by making use of the speech and the imagery of plain everyday life. Willingly obeying the laws of His country He sanctified those human ties, especially family ones, which are the source of social structures. He chose to lead the life proper to an artisan of His time and place.

Our local parish project is a very important one: to employ a part-time parish catechist to add to the great work already going on at St



Augustine's in First Holy Communion and Confirmation, RCIA etc. by wonderful volunteers. There are so many other opportunities for catechesis and work amongst the youth & young adults of our parish which we could begin through a new employee.

Prior to the summer we had received committed pledges of **£173,000** (leading to £42,000 for the parish project). It is still important and necessary that we top up this amount, and Fr Philip asks those who are able to, especially those who committed to pledging back at the 'commitment weekend' but have not yet returned their official pledge form, to do so soon. SCHOOLS

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS to our Catholic Primary & Secondary schools requires the Parish Priest to provide a priest's reference as testimony of **Catholic practice, i.e attendance, every week, at Sunday (or Saturday evening) Mass.** This accords with the diocesan guidance for priests, http://www.rcdow.org.uk/fileupload/upload/prf_4117200691341.pdf. In order to help him be just and fair to the practising Catholics of our parish, Fr Philip will continue to adopt the pattern of occasionally in the next few months asking those who will require a priest's form to be signed to come and see him briefly (each and every time he asks) after Sunday Mass. **This concerns those whose children are now in nursery-year and year 6 in 2014/15.**

FLOWER TEAM needs more help for about 1½ hours each Friday afternoon. No experience is necessary and if you can help, please contact Gemma on 462215.


