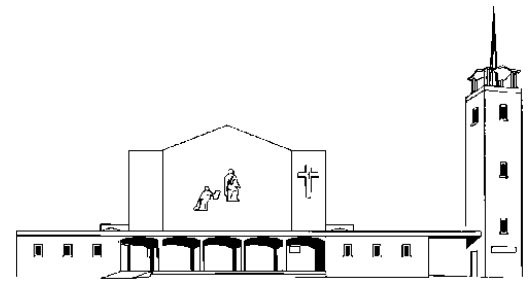

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

12th APRIL 2015

GOSPEL: John 20: 19–31

Eight days later, Jesus came.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

AN ONGOING 'HAPPY EASTER' TO YOU ALL! To those who were away for Easter, I wish you a blessed and joyful Easter, and a reminder to each of us that the celebration of Easter continues through the whole 7 weeks of Eastertide, right up to Pentecost in late May. This is made clear by the Paschal Candle standing in prime position in the centre of the church, as it has done since the Easter Vigil last weekend when it was first lit: "The Light of Christ."



The Gospel passage for this 2nd Sunday of Easter recounts the event of a week after Easter when Our Blessed Lord appears another time to the apostles, with St Thomas present — after his absence, and doubt, a week earlier. St Thomas's recognition of the awesome truth of our Lord's resurrection brings him to pronounce that beautiful affirmation, "My Lord and my God!" He encourages us, especially when we have doubts or our trust in God is at a low ebb, to have extra faith in the Lord. St Thomas saw with his own eyes the evidence of the resurrection, and strengthens us to honour Jesus fully as Lord and God. We can give our whole lives over, in trust, to Christ.

I shall be away this Saturday to concelebrate a friend's wedding in Sussex, and am grateful to Fr Philip Law, chaplain to John Henry Newman School, Stevenage, for coming to celebrate the Saturday evening Mass. In the coming week I shall be on a trip to Rome, and Mgr Peter Wilson, and Fr Joseph Thayil, will celebrate the Mass here Tuesday–Friday.

May God bless us all in our ongoing celebration of Eastertide. Christ is risen, alleluia! Fr Philip

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 47–48:



The well-being of the individual person and of human and Christian society is intimately linked with the healthy condition of that community produced by marriage and family. Hence Christians and all men who hold this community in high esteem sincerely rejoice in the various ways by which men today find help in fostering this community of love and perfecting its life, and by which parents are assisted in their lofty calling.

... The intimate partnership of married life and love has been established by the Creator and qualified by His laws, and is rooted in the conjugal covenant of irrevocable personal consent. Hence by that human act whereby spouses mutually bestow and accept each other a relationship arises which by divine will and in the eyes of society too is a lasting one. For the good of the spouses and their offspring as well as of society, the existence of the sacred bond no longer depends on human decisions alone. For, God Himself is the author of matrimony, endowed as it is with various benefits and purposes. All of these have a very decisive bearing on the continuation of the human race, on the personal development and eternal destiny of the individual members of a family, and on the dignity, stability, peace and prosperity of the family itself and of human society as a whole.

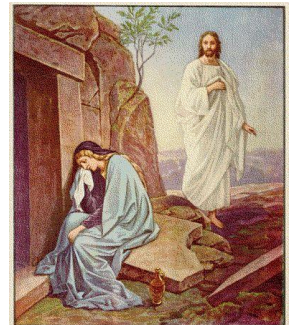
