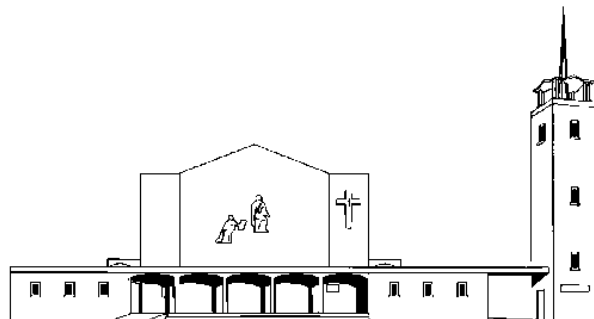

GOSPEL: Mark 7: 1–8, 14–15, 21–23

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

AFTER SEVERAL WEEKS HEARING FROM CHAPTER 6 OF ST JOHN, we return this Sunday to the cycle of Gospel readings from St Mark. Jesus urges us today to take care of our inner life — not to live hypocritically, professing one thing but doing another — but to be inwardly *and* outwardly saintly.

THE RCIA COURSE — FOR THOSE WISHING TO BECOME CATHOLICS, or those adult Catholics who have not yet been Confirmed — is going to begin in a week or so (Tuesday 8th September), so I ask again if there are others in the parish, or associated with the parish already, who wish to come forward. It's a wonderful programme, in which the participants/enquirers are accompanied by myself and a number of committed parishioners, to help discover more about the Faith, and to discern whether God is

calling them to Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist. Anyone wishing to find out more should contact me *this week* so that they can be fully informed about what it entails. Green sheets with a fuller explanation can be found by the Newsletters.

ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL: with the imminent approach of the Commons debate on the Rob Marris Bill ('assisted dying'), on Friday 11th September, I urge you, please, if you have not done so already, to express our deeply held Catholic faith in the inadmissibility of killing our fellow human beings who are suffering terminal illnesses. We all have compassion for those who are sick and have diseases that are incurable, but assisting them to die by a positive action such as a lethal injection is immoral, and this latest attempt to legislate for it must be fought strongly. Our democratic right — and our Christian duty — is to appeal to our legislators to oppose this Bill. From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 62:



Although the Church has contributed much to the development of culture, experience shows that, for circumstantial reasons, it is sometimes difficult to harmonize culture with Christian teaching. These difficulties do not necessarily harm the life of faith, rather they can stimulate the mind to a deeper and more accurate understanding of the faith. The recent studies and findings of science, history and philosophy raise new questions which affect life and which demand new theological investigations. Furthermore, theologians, within the requirements and methods proper to theology, are invited to seek continually for more suitable ways of communicating doctrine to the men of their times; for the deposit of Faith or the truths are one thing and the manner in which they are enunciated, in the same meaning and understanding, is another.

LATIN MASS: The monthly Latin Mass, with sung chants, will be at 5.00pm next **Sunday 6th September**.

ITALIAN MASS: Please note that there will be NO Italian Mass until **Saturday 12th September**.

FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP: 3rd Friday of each month, 7.30–8.30pm: **next meeting Sept 18th**. A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord. All welcome!

Fr Philip thanks those who have donated to our 'Growing in Faith' initiative, to benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.**

CATECHETICS

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: application forms for the new First-Holy-Communion programme (for practising Catholic children in Yr3 or above) will be available from the first Sunday of September after Mass (and not available from the Presbytery).

CONFIRMATION 2016: The next session will be held on **Monday 7th September** from 7.15-8.45pm in the crypt for parents and candidates.

"RCIA" – 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **The course will begin 8th September at 7pm** but if anyone is considering becoming a Catholic (or is an adult Catholic wishing to be confirmed), please contact Fr Philip as soon as possible. There are green leaflets outlining RCIA by the newsletters.

BAPTISM COURSE: The next course will be held on **Tuesday 1st and Wednesday 9th September** from 7.30–9pm in the presbytery. The course of both evenings must be completed before a

Baptism can be arranged. To enrol on the course, please contact the presbytery.

SCHOOLS

WORRIED ABOUT SCHOOL COSTS in the coming year? There is a Christian-based local grant-giving body, managed by the URC, the 'Broxbourne Educational Trust' that you can apply to for assistance (max. £500) with costs for educational activities for young people under 25 — so this would include university students. SCHOOL ADMISSIONS to our Catholic Primary & Secondary schools require the Parish Priest to provide a priest's reference as testimony of **Catholic practice, i.e attendance, every week, at Sunday (or Saturday evening) Mass.** This accords with the diocesan guidance for priests, http://www.rcdow.org.uk/fileupload/upload/prf_4117200691341.pdf. In order to help him be just and fair to the practising Catholics of our parish, Fr Philip will continue to adopt the pattern of occasionally in the next few months asking those who will require a priest's form to be signed to come and see him briefly (each and every time he asks) after Sunday Mass. **This concerns those whose children will be in nursery-year and year 6 in 2015/16.** When Fr Philip last asked, there were 8 requests for references for Secondary School, and 3 requests for references for Primary School.

JUSTICE & PEACE & PRO-LIFE

ASSISTED-SUICIDE BILL: "On Friday 11th September the House of Commons will debate and vote on a Bill to legalise assisted suicide. This will put the most vulnerable people in our society at risk. Please contact your MP, urging them to attend the debate and vote against the Bill. You can send an e-mail to your MP via the Catholic Bishops' Conference website (www.catholicnews.org.uk/assisted-suicide) or send a letter by post, a draft of which can be found at the back of the Church. Even better, you could ask to see your MP and express your concerns directly." (Cardinal Vincent Nichols)

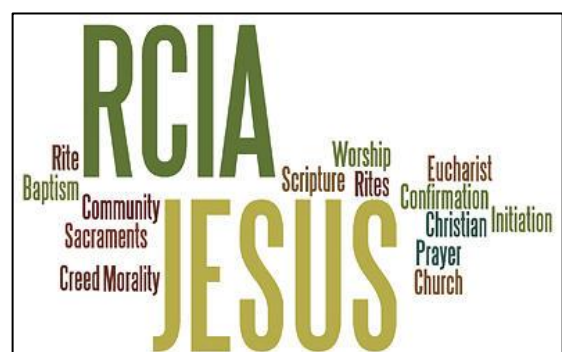
SAINT OF THE WEEK

Wednesday 3rd September

St Gregory the Great
Pope & Doctor



Pope St Gregory I was pope from 3rd September 590 until his death in 604. Gregory is well known for his writings, which were more prolific than those of any of his predecessors as pope. He was the first of the popes to come from a monastic background. He is considered a saint in the Catholic Church and also in the Eastern Orthodox Church. Immediately after his death, Gregory was canonized by popular acclaim. It was he who sent St Augustine ("of Canterbury") from the monastery in Rome to evangelize southern England in 597, and so we have much to be grateful for from this wise and saintly Pope.
