Why should I be honoured with a visit from the mother of my Lord?

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

As we celebrate today the fourth Sunday of Advent, we start now to hear of the events immediately leading up to the earthly birth of Our Blessed Lord. The Gospel extract in 'Year C' gives us the moment of Our Lady's 'visitation' to her kinswoman Elizabeth. In a moment of profound beauty, not only do these holy mothers greet each other, but so do their baby boys. In an action that is deeply prophetic — given the fact that nowadays so many unborn children are killed through abortion — the unborn St John the Baptist responds with tangible joy to the presence of the Son of God, also unborn in the womb of Mary. Elizabeth pays due honour to "the Mother of my Lord," as she calls Mary. Indeed, in these final days of Advent I would like us to contemplate in particular the role of Mary, and her deep and trusting faith, as she approached the



time of Jesus's birth. May we imitate her practical faith and charity out of love for Jesus.

Please come to two important occasions in these days prior to our celebration of Christmas:

- **Sunday 20**th **Dec at 5pm**: PARISH CAROL SERVICE, a beautiful sequence of Scripture and music to explore the wonderful prophecies and events of Christ's birth;
- **Monday 21st Dec at 11.30am OR 7.30pm:** PENITENTIAL SERVICES with CONFESSION, a chance to avail yourself of God's mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. A number of priests will be available for these services, and it is important to prepare well for Christmas through our being forgiven our sins. The *Pilgrimage Companion* mentioned above also has a section dedicated to preparing for Confession, so please make use of that.

We pray for the hope and peace that Advent should bring to us as we await the Lord. Fr Philip
