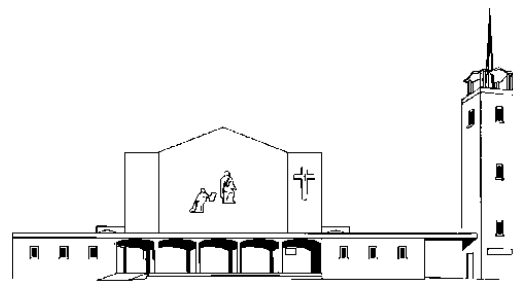

He taught them with authority.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

IN THE GOSPEL TODAY, JESUS COMES TO CAPERNAUM, which He will use as the base for His Galilean ministry. It's the village that Peter lives in, by the lakeside. In the synagogue, He heals a man possessed, and manifests His divine authority, to the amazement of the people.

THIS WEEKEND I WILL BE SPEAKING ABOUT THE 'VOLUNTEERING' EXERCISE that we will undertake together next Sunday. I want to offer you a chance to volunteer your time and talents to re-invigorate many of the tasks that help our parish live its life, on many levels. To that end, I will concentrate in this Sunday's homily on the need as

parishioners to give more fully to our parish, so that God's Gospel message can be furthered in all sorts of little ways here. In the meantime, do please pray about your contribution to the life of this parish, and whether God is calling you to be more active for Him and His people.

THIS SUNDAY IS 'EDUCATION SUNDAY.' We are reminded in Bishop John's letter (available from the porch) of the huge contribution that Catholic schools make to the life of this country. There is sometimes criticism levelled at our Catholic schools — which usually perform very well academically — that they are exclusive, or that they are selective, or that they don't manifest proper diversity. In fact, nothing could be further from the truth. 36% of children in Catholic Primary schools (and 30% in Secondary) are from ethnic backgrounds. 18% of children in our schools are from the most socially deprived areas, which is much higher than the national average. We congratulate our own Primary and Secondary schools on the great work they do with our young people, and pray that they continue to spread the Gospel to them, and with them.

May God bless our families, parish, schools as we seek each day to follow Christ. Fr Philip



From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 41:



The Church can anchor the dignity of human nature against all tides of opinion, for example those which undervalue the human body or idolize it. By no human law can the personal dignity and liberty of man be so aptly safeguarded as by the Gospel of Christ which has been entrusted to the Church. For this Gospel announces and proclaims the freedom of the sons of God, and repudiates all the bondage which ultimately results from

sin; it has a sacred reverence for the dignity of conscience and its freedom of choice, constantly advises that all human talents be employed in God's service and men's, and, finally, commends all to the charity of all. This agrees with the basic law of the Christian dispensation. For though the same God is Saviour and Creator, Lord of human history as well as of salvation history, in the divine arrangement itself, the rightful autonomy of the creature, and particularly of man is not withdrawn, but is rather re-established in its own dignity and strengthened in it.

ASH WEDNESDAY is on **18th February** and Mass will be at 9.30am, 12 noon and 8pm. If you are a Eucharistic Minister, reader or altar server and can assist at the Masses, please sign your name on the lists at the back of the church. **Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (for those aged 16–60) and abstinence (for those aged 14+).** This means that we consciously choose to eat less — one main meal only — and that (as on all Fridays) we eat no meat whatsoever.

SAINTS HELPING US TODAY: Fr Philip will be showing a six-session DVD series exploring Saints Thérèse of Lisieux, Benedict, Francis of Assisi, Patrick, Ignatius of Loyola and Catherine of Siena during Lent. 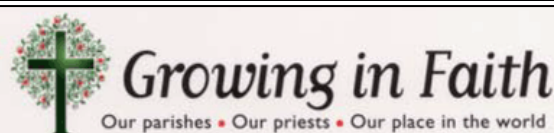
HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS

Fr Philip thanks those who have recently donated to our 'Growing in Faith' initiative, to benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. With some very large new donations, **we have raised now pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.** An update on 'Growing in Faith' can be seen on the noticeboard above the newspapers, though it doesn't yet include the most recent pledges. Fr Philip continues exploratory discussions with various contacts about filling the post of a catechetical co-ordinator. There are so many other opportunities for catechesis and work amongst the youth & young adults of our parish which we could begin through a new employee.
