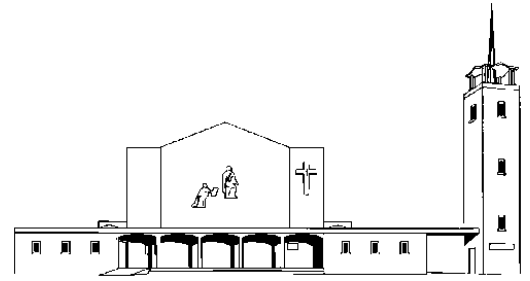

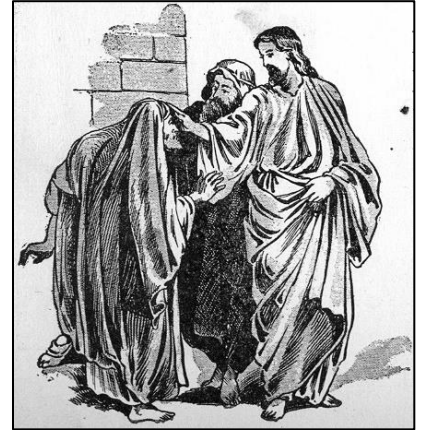

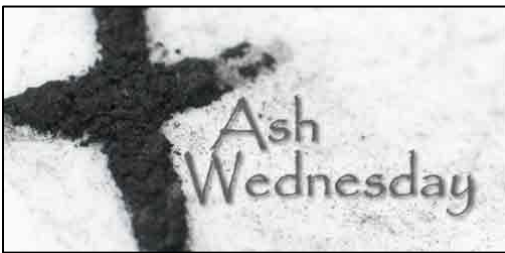
The leprosy left him at once and he was cured.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

OUR FINAL PASSAGE FROM CHAPTER 1 OF ST MARK'S GOSPEL, before we enter Lent, sees our Lord once again healing a man. This man was a leper, a contagious disease, and considered ritually unclean, and someone to shun. Our Lord does not ignore him, but has compassion on the leper, and touches him, and heals him. Who might it be that we ignore, shun, or studiously avoid? Is the Lord calling us to be back in touch with that person, to reach out to them with a hand of friendship?



LAST WEEKEND I WAS VERY PLEASED WITH THE 'VOLUNTEERING' EXERCISE that we undertook together. Quite apart from all those of you who indicated that you volunteer in various capacities already, some 90 parishioners filled in cards to make themselves available in new ways. I am grateful for that. I intend to leave this opportunity *open for one more week* — cards for filling in are available still alongside the newsletters. Please find a card, if you wish to volunteer, and return it to me, or post it through the Presbytery door in the next few days. Over the coming week I will start to analyse the response and communicate in various ways with the groups which you have offered to support. I have been touched by the way in which you responded to this request, and am hopeful for a lot of good to come from this. May the Lord build up this Parish — for it is *His* work we do!



THE PENITENTIAL SEASON OF LENT BEGINS THIS WEDNESDAY with our keeping of 'Ash Wednesday.' I hope and pray that you will *all* be able to attend Mass that day, *along with your children* who are on their half-term break. It is important as a parish that we keep Lent well, and there is no better way to begin Lent than with the sign of the penitence — the ashes — on our foreheads. **Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from**

CARDINAL'S MASS OF THANKSGIVING FOR MARRIAGE: The Cardinal invites all couples in the Diocese who are celebrating their 10th, 25th, 30th, 40th, 50th and 60th (and every year over 60) wedding anniversary of Catholic marriage in 2015 to a Mass on **Sat 23rd May at 3pm** at Westminster Cathedral. LENT

ASH WEDNESDAY is on **18th February** and Mass will be at 9.30am, 12 noon and 8pm. If you are a Eucharistic Minister, reader or altar server and can assist at the Masses, please sign your name on the lists at the back of the church. **Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting (for those aged 16–60) and abstinence (for those aged 14+).** This means that we consciously choose to eat less — one main meal only — and that (as on all Fridays) we eat no meat whatsoever.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: the "Way of the Cross" is followed in church each Friday (12.30pm, after Mass, & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass.) And in Italian at 5.30pm each Friday.

LENTEN ALMS are collected each year in support of charitable causes. The Archbishop has decided that this year's charity will be *Caritas*.

Caritas has been created to help parishes set up and run projects designed to give practical help to the poor, the hungry, the lonely and the vulnerable in our diocese. But its work is only possible if it receives donations. To find out more about *Caritas*, please do take a leaflet which are beside the newsletters. **You will find the box throughout Lent in front of the lectern.**

'**SAINTS HELPING US TODAY**': Fr Philip will be showing a six-session DVD series exploring Saints Thérèse of Lisieux, Benedict, Francis of Assisi, Patrick, Ignatius of Loyola and Catherine of Siena, during Lent. The talks will be on **Lent Wednesdays at 10.15am** after coffee in the crypt. Dates are: 25th Feb, 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th March & 1st April.

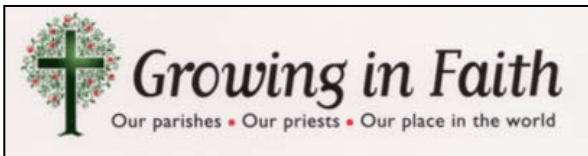
HOUSEBOUND & SICK PARISHIONERS

Fr Philip thanks those who have recently donated to our 'Growing in Faith' initiative, to benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. With some very large new donations, **we have raised now pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.** An update on 'Growing in Faith' can be seen on the noticeboard above the newspapers, though it doesn't yet include the most recent pledges.

Fr Philip continues exploratory discussions with various contacts about filling the post of a catechetical co-ordinator. There are so many other opportunities for catechesis and work amongst the youth & young adults of our parish which we could begin through a new employee.
