

GOSPEL: Mark 1: 14–20

Repent, and believe the Good News.

**My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,**

**AS WE CONTINUE, NOW, OUR WEEKS OF ORDINARY TIME**, we start to hear of the beginning of Our Lord's public ministry. In these early verses of St Mark's Gospel, Jesus calls to His service the first apostles, Simon and Andrew, James and John, from their fishing. It is an important reflection for us, to realise that even the Son of God thought it necessary — indeed, best — to involve others in His work of evangelization. Our Lord did not 'go it alone' and work His wonders and miracles, and our salvation, in isolation. He deliberately and specifically called others to His side to assist and promote, and witness to, His divine work. As we live the life of the Church together, as the apostles did, we need to see ourselves as co-operating in this same work of Christ, for the salvation of the world. Think of the words of St Teresa of Avila:



*Yours are the feet with which He walks to do good, Yours are the hands, with which He blesses all the world. Yours are the hands, yours are the feet, Yours are the eyes, you are His body. Christ has no body now but yours.*

**So ... I WOULD LIKE TO REITERATE MY NOTICE OF LAST WEEK** regarding our volunteering in various ways in the life of the parish. To this end, in a couple of weeks' time, I invite you to take part in a little exercise with me, carried out during the Sunday Mass. I will be offering you a chance to volunteer your time and talents to re-invigorate many of the tasks — some larger, some smaller — that help our parish live its life, on many levels. I want to highlight this as a key event of these weeks of 'ordinary time,' and will be speaking about this a bit more next Sunday in the homily. In the meantime, do please pray about your contribution to the life of this parish, and whether God is calling you to be more active for Him and His people.

**I hope that we can make a prayerful reflection on this, together, as a parish.**

**From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 41:**



[The Catholic Church] knows that man is constantly worked upon by God's spirit, and hence can never be altogether indifferent to the problems of religion. The experience of past ages proves this, as do numerous indications in our own times. For man will always yearn to know, at least in an obscure way, what is the meaning of his life, of his activity, of his death. The very presence of the Church recalls these

problems to his mind. But only God, Who created man to His own image and ransomed him from sin, provides the most adequate answer to the questions, and this He does through what He has revealed in Christ His Son, Who became man. Whoever follows after Christ, the perfect man, becomes himself more of a man. For by His incarnation the Father's Word assumed, and sanctified through His cross and resurrection, the whole of man, body and soul, and through that totality the whole of nature created by God for man's use.

#### **SAINT OF THE WEEK**

***STS TIMOTHY & TITUS, BISHOPS***  
***26<sup>th</sup> JANUARY***

Timothy and Titus were traveling companions of St. Paul and they shared in his work of bringing Jesus to others. Both these men were Paul's representatives. Paul often sent them ahead to prepare the people for his arrival in a new town. After establishing a new Christian community, Paul would move on to a new area to share the Gospel. He often asked Timothy or Titus to stay behind to support and encourage the new community in living their faith. Timothy and Titus were both appointed as bishops. This was a sign of their leadership and faithfulness to the early Church. We can pray to these two saints, asking them to help us to become more patient and considerate in our daily lives, as they were.
