

THE EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

4TH JANUARY 2015

GOSPEL: Matthew 2: 1–12

We saw his star and have come to do the king homage.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

A HAPPY FEAST-DAY OF THE EPIPHANY TO YOU ALL! This is another of the great feasts of the Christmas season, and an important occasion. We recall the arrival of Magi from the East — outsiders, non-Jews — who have come to do the Lord homage. By their coming to seek Christ from *outside* Israel, they immediately point to the fact that Jesus will be the Saviour of all peoples: all nations and races, and in fact, all humanity. This is therefore a great feast for the worldwide Church: a rejoicing that the Jewish Messiah has come — but He has come for us all! The gold acknowledges Him as King of Kings; the incense shows that He is the very God Himself; and the myrrh ointment signifies One born to die. In this great feast of Epiphany we are drawn into the world-changing mystery of the baby born at Bethlehem! As He has given Himself to the world, we should give ourselves entirely to Him.

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 39:



We do not know the time for the consummation of the earth and of humanity, nor do we know how all things will be transformed. As deformed by sin, the shape of this world will pass away; but we are taught that God is preparing a new dwelling place and a new earth where justice will abide, and whose blessedness will answer and surpass all the longings for peace which spring up in the human heart. Then, with death

overcome, the sons of God will be raised up in Christ, and what was sown in weakness and corruption will be invested with incorruptibility. Enduring with charity and its fruits, all that creation which God made on man's account will be unchained from the bondage of vanity. Therefore, while we are warned that it profits a man nothing if he gain the whole world and lose himself, the expectation of a new earth must not weaken but rather stimulate our concern for cultivating this one. For here grows the body of a new human family, a body which even now is able to give some kind of foreshadowing of the new age.

JUSTICE & PEACE & PRO-LIFE

SPUC WHITE FLOWER APPEAL: The Society for the Protection of Unborn Children (SPUC) will be holding its annual appeal **next weekend.** In common with the Catholic Church, SPUC defends and upholds the sanctity of human life from conception until natural death. The Society's work covers a wide spectrum of pro-life, pro-family issues. It seeks to protect unborn children from abortion and defends the disabled, elderly and incapacitated from euthanasia and assisted suicide. SPUC also provides trained speakers for schools and offers pro-life support for teachers,

MISCELLANEOUS

EPIPHANY PARTY will be held on **Saturday 3rd January** after the 6.30pm Mass in the crypt. We will have a shared meal and if you can bring either a sweet or savoury dish, please do. Drinks will be provided by parish.

PARISH MISSION: Thank you to everyone who made a donation to St Patrick's Community for the Parish Mission. A total of £1,292.71 was raised, which has been sent on to them for their ongoing work of evangelization.

CRIB APPEAL: Each year the Catholic Children's Society (Westminster) works to support over 9,000 disadvantaged children and families across the entire diocese. Studies suggest child poverty will rise from 2.3m (2014) to 3.2m by 2020. This figure reveals just how deeply child poverty reaches into our communities, even those areas generally regarded as well off. The Catholic Children's Society listens to people's needs and responds to the "cry of the poor" with imaginative and efficiently delivered programs. With the difficult economic situation continuing the Society relies entirely on the generosity of individuals to continue their work and need to raise a minimum of £100,000 this Christmas.
