

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

22nd MARCH 2015

GOSPEL: John 12: 20–30

If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

'PASSIONTIDE' BEGINS NOW, WITH THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT. The statues and crosses are covered with their purple drapes, and we move into the more sombre conclusion of Lent, the time when we



particularly meditate on Jesus's suffering and death. Jesus says, in the beautiful Gospel passage of this Sunday: "Now My soul is troubled ... Shall I say 'Father, save Me from this hour'? ... But it was for this very reason that I have come to this hour." Jesus agonizes over the Passion and Death He must face, and yet, out of perfect love for us, and for the Father, He sees it through. He uses the image of the 'grain of wheat' — it can't yield its great harvest of new life without falling to the ground and dying. Jesus does this for us: He dies, but He rises again, taking the 'sting' out of death for us, and allowing us to rise again with Him. We become that extended 'harvest' of life that happens only because of His death. Let's enter this Passiontide with prayer and feeling.

I REALLY THANK YOU FOR HAVING PONDERED, OVER THE LAST WEEK OR TWO, your contribution to the parish's regular offertory collection. We need, as has been made clear, to increase our offertory, since we have had three successive years of deficit. So, today, after my brief homily, you will get the chance to indicate your hopes / requests regarding this, on the cards that will be distributed. For example, you can request a standing-order form, or a box of parish offertory envelopes; and for all those who do pay UK tax, I urge you to sign the gift-aid declaration. I am VERY grateful indeed for your doing this, so as to secure the financial base of our parish, in its day-to-day expenditure. Let me give you just one statistic: suppose a parishioner put a certain cash gift in the basket on, say, 40 Sundays a year when he/she was here ... If that same weekly gift were transferred over to a regular standing order, and if gift-aid were added, that's automatically a 62% increase on the amount received! Thanks for responding kindly to this request to 'up' our parish support; the next generation deserves from us a healthy and financially stable parish, so THANK YOU for having considered that question: "Am I giving what I can / should to my parish."

May God bless us as we meditate on the saving Passion of Our Lord Jesus.

PARISH ‘PENANCE’ FOR LENT: in Lent, we will have no final hymn at Sunday Mass, and then we will **keep silence** in the body of the church, so as to allow a period of prayer for those who wish to remain after Mass in Thanksgiving.
