

GOSPEL: John 2: 13–25

Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

ON THIS THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT, we hear of the next in the series of Old-Testament covenants. Two weeks ago we heard of the ancient covenant with Noah; last week, of the covenant with Abraham after God had put him to the test. This Sunday we hear of Moses receiving the Ten Commandments from the Lord on Mt Sinai. The Ten Commandments remain the heart of our Christian rule of life, and should be meditated on by each of us, and kept with all our heart.

Homilies 33–40 in the sequence of 'Year of Faith' sermons that I preached in June–August 2013 discuss the Ten Commandments, and you might well wish to go back and read them online (<http://yofhomilies.wordpress.com>).

OVER THE REMAINING WEEKS OF LENT, WE ALSO NEED TO THINK ABOUT OUR PARISH FINANCES. I will be explaining a little during the Masses of this Sunday, and then next weekend a member of the parish's Finance Committee will address the issue in more detail. Whilst we have had appeals for some other causes, we have not had a 'Planned Giving' campaign — specifically for the day-to-day running of the parish — since 2007, before my arrival here. We are in urgent need, now, to seek an increase in the regular offertory giving by you parishioners. Whilst costs are kept to a minimum, we have not been covering costs for the last three years. I know that many of you have been generous — and continue to be generous — in various ways of giving, and the last thing I want is to be criticised for "always talking about money." Nevertheless, together we have to find ways to increase our regular income, and I am sure that we can do this if we all play our part.

May God bless our continued experience of Lent with faithfulness to our disciplines! Fr Philip

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 43:



Although by the power of the Holy Spirit the Church will remain the faithful spouse of her Lord and will never cease to be the sign of salvation on earth, still she is very well aware that among her members, both clerical and lay, some have been unfaithful to the Spirit of God during the course of many centuries; in the present age, too, it does not escape the Church how great a distance lies between the message she offers and the human failings of those to whom the Gospel is entrusted. Whatever be the judgment of history on these defects, we ought to be conscious of them, and struggle against them energetically, lest they inflict harm on spread of the Gospel. The Church also realizes that in working out her relationship with the world she always has great need of the ripening which comes with the experience of the centuries. Led by the Holy Spirit, Mother Church unceasingly exhorts her sons "to purify and renew themselves so that the sign of Christ can shine more brightly on the face of the Church."

Fr Philip thanks those who have recently donated to our ‘Growing in Faith’ initiative, to benefit both the diocese, and our own parish’s project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. With some very large new donations, **we have raised now pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.** An update on ‘Growing in Faith’ can be seen on the noticeboard above the newspapers, though it doesn’t yet include the most recent pledges. Fr Philip continues exploratory discussions with various contacts about filling the post of a catechetical co-ordinator.
