

GOSPEL: John 15: 9–17

A man can have no greater love than to lay down his life for his friends.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

MAY IS THE MONTH OF MARY! And it is indeed a beautiful spring month to devote to the Mother of Our Blessed Lord, and to do her honour. As we pay homage to her, we must bear two things in mind: (i) that devotion to Our Lady is never ‘on a par’ with the worship given to Almighty God — she is His “handmaid,” as she said herself; but (ii) that we cannot, and do not, ‘un-make’ the choice that God Himself made, when He asked her to be the mother of His only Son, and to give Him flesh in this world — and this is why we treat her with such respect and love. Her funeral will be on **Tuesday 12th May at 9.15am**. *May they rest in peace.*

MONTH OF OUR LADY: During May, a decade of the Rosary will be prayed before each Sunday Mass. The Rosary in Italian will be said on Thursday evenings at 7pm.
