



GOSPEL: Matthew 5: 1–12

Rejoice and be glad, for your reward will be great in heaven.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

ALL SAINTS' DAY, 1ST NOVEMBER, IS A GREAT FEAST DAY of the Church, when we recall the huge multitude, impossible to number, which has been admitted into the presence of God in heaven. Some of these we name, as canonized saints of the Church — such as St Louis and St Zélie Martin, canonized two weeks ago — but the great number are simply those ordinary men and women who, having lived lives of grace on earth, and having not died in mortal sin, have received their purification in purgatory and are now in the presence of Almighty God in “eternal rest.” We look to ‘All the Saints’ as our great inspiration for life, and for their prayers, that we may stay on the ‘straight and narrow,’ the path of Jesus Christ that leads us also to heaven.



THE CHURCH'S SYNOD ON MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE concluded last Sunday, and Cardinal Vincent, our Archbishop, who attended the Synod, has written us a Pastoral Letter for this Sunday to bring together his reflections on the Synod and on the feast-day of All Saints.

OUR NOVEMBER DEVOTIONS — IN THIS MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS — have a particular focus this weekend with our prayers for the dead at the local (Ware Road) Cemetery. It is always a moving and prayerful occasion, and a moment of spiritual support by our parish community for those bereaved. Please make a special effort to come this Sunday at 3pm. The Rosary will be prayed in procession around the cemetery (c. 20mins) and then I am available to come to individual graves, for those who wish, for a prayer and blessing (c. 40mins). Throughout November we will be praying for our deceased loved ones: *may they rest in peace.*

May we pray for the grace to live our own family life in accordance with God's will. Fr Philip

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on ‘The Church in the Modern World,’ n. 70:



Investments ... must be directed toward procuring employment and sufficient income for the people both now and in the future. Whoever makes decisions concerning these investments and the planning of the economy ... are bound to keep these objectives in mind and to recognize their serious obligation of watching, on the one hand, that provision be made for the necessities required for a decent life both of individuals and of the whole community and, on the other, of looking out for the future and of establishing a right balance between the needs of present-day consumption, both individual and collective, and the demands of investing for the generation to come. They should also always bear in mind the urgent needs of underdeveloped countries or regions. In monetary matters they should beware of hurting the welfare of their own country or of other countries. Care should also be taken lest the economically weak countries unjustly suffer any loss from a change in the value of money.

PRAYERS AT THE CEMETERY: Fr Philip will lead the annual visit to the cemetery to pray the Rosary for the deceased members of the parish **this Sunday 1st November.** Please meet inside the main gates off Ware Road at 3pm.

MASS WITH BISHOP SHERRINGTON: on **Tuesday 10th November,** Bishop John will be here to celebrate Mass with the priests of the Deanery — the annual Mass for local deceased clergy. **Mass that day will be at 11am,** and not at 9.15am.

FIRST FRIDAY: The first Friday Mass will be at 7.30pm on **Friday 6th Nov.** This will be followed by the Holy Hour at 8pm, which is always prayed for the pro-life cause.

MASS FOR THE DECEASED OF THE PAST YEAR: **Sat 14th November, 6.30pm Mass** will be a special Mass at which we remember and pray for the deceased of the past 12 months. Written invitations have been sent to the bereaved families of those whose funerals have been celebrated here in the parish, but all who have lost a dear one in the past year may wish to make their Sunday Mass that weekend. **Volunteers are needed to help with the refreshments in the crypt after Mass. If you can help, please contact the presbytery.**

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR (3rd Sunday of each month) takes place at 5pm **Sunday 15th November** with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction.

FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP: 3rd Friday of each month, 7.30–8.30pm: **next meeting Nov 20th.** A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord. All welcome!

On the noticeboard is now posted the most recent summary of our parish's 'Growing in Faith' donations, which benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.**

As yet we have not sourced anyone to take up the post of a parish catechist, but Fr Philip is in discussion with friends in the diocese who have experience in this area, to try and find a recommended and suitably qualified person for the post. Do pray that this can come about soon.

CATECHETICS

FR PHILIP'S TALKS: In the light of the recent

Synod on 'Marriage & The Family' at the Vatican, Fr Philip will give one more talk on Catholic Teaching on Wednesday evening at 8pm in church: (III) **11th November**: Why not Same-Sex 'Marriage'? On a table in the porch are many materials in connection with my talk series — both FREE paper handouts, and also a series of CTS booklets which are priced.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: The second meeting for parents will be on **Wed 4th Nov 8–9pm** in the crypt. The second session for the children will be **Sat 7th Nov 10am–12noon**.

CONFIRMATION 2016: next session held on **Monday 2nd November** from 7.15–8.45pm in the crypt for **parents and candidates**. Candidates will need to have read chapter five of the Gospel of Mark. **As mentioned in the parents' letter in July, the course has a £10 cost for materials, so please hand that in soon.**

"RCIA" – 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **The course continues on the 3rd November at 7pm.**

BAPTISM COURSE: The next course will be held on **Fridays 13th and 27th Nov, 7.30-9pm** in the presbytery. The course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged. To enrol on the course, please contact the Presbytery.

MARRIAGE-PREPARATION COURSE: There will be a course running from early February for engaged couples. If anyone is planning on marrying in 2016, please contact the presbytery as soon as possible. Please note you need to give at least 6 months' notice. Catholics may marry **ONLY** in the Catholic Church, and any other ceremony — without a dispensation — is not a valid marriage for a Catholic.

SCHOOLS

SCHOOL ADMISSIONS to our Catholic Primary & Secondary schools gives the opportunity to the Parish Priest to provide Certificate of Catholic practice, i.e **certifying attendance, every week, at Sunday (or Saturday evening) Mass**.
