

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE SYNOD ON MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE continues this week at the Vatican, with almost 320 bishops and other participants/observers. There have been many heartfelt interventions and speeches in this first week, upholding the great dignity of the Sacrament of Marriage and the beauty of family life that springs from marriage. These few lines caught my eye — from a speech by American Archbishop (of Philadelphia) Charles Chaput:

The work of this Synod needs to show much more confidence in the Word of God, the transformative power of



grace, and the ability of people to actually live what the Church believes. And it should honour the heroism of abandoned spouses who remain faithful to their vows and the teaching of the Church. ... We need to call people to perseverance in grace and to trust in the greatness God intended for them — not confirm them in their errors. Marriage embodies Christian hope — hope made flesh and sealed permanently in the love of a man and a woman. This Synod needs to preach that truth more clearly with the radical passion of the Cross and Resurrection.

Please continue to pray for our Archbishop, Cardinal Vincent, and Peter Doyle the bishop of Northampton, and all the Synod fathers as they continue their discussions and deliberations under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I used <http://www.adoptasynodfather.org/> and got allocated the Jesuit father, Fr Antonio Spadaro to pray for specially in these weeks. Why not do the same, and also remember to use the prayer card that I enclosed with the Newsletters last week.

May we pray for the grace to live our own family life in accordance with God's will. Fr Philip

From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 67:



Since economic activity for the most part implies the associated work of human beings, any way of organizing and directing it which may be detrimental to any working men and women would be wrong and inhuman. It happens too often, however, even in our days, that workers are reduced to the level of being slaves to their own work. This is by no means justified by the so-called economic laws. The entire process of productive work, therefore, must be adapted to the needs of the person and to his way of life, above all to his domestic life, especially in respect to mothers of families, always with due regard for sex and age. The opportunity, moreover, should be granted to workers to unfold their own abilities and personality through the performance of their work. Applying their time and strength to their employment with a due sense of responsibility, they should also all enjoy sufficient rest and leisure to cultivate their familial, cultural, social and religious life.

Fr Philip thanks those who have donated to our 'Growing in Faith' initiative, to benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.**

CATECHETICS

FR PHILIP'S TALKS: In the light of the present Synod on 'Marriage & The Family' at the Vatican, Fr Philip will give two more talks on Catholic Teaching on Wednesday evenings at 8pm in church: (II) **21st Oct:** Saving Marriage; Breakdown, Re-Marriage & Annulment; (III) 11th November: Why not Same-Sex 'Marriage'?

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: The second meeting for parents will be on **Wed 4th Nov 8–9pm** in the crypt. The second session for the children will be Sat 7th Nov 10am–12noon.
