

**SYNOD ON  
THE FAMILY**

4 - 25 OCTOBER



**THE SYNOD ON MARRIAGE AND FAMILY LIFE** in Rome will end today with the final Mass at St Peter's Basilica. We have prayed earnestly for this time of reflection by the Synod Fathers, and we ask that the Holy Spirit guide the Holy

Father, Pope Francis, as he takes the final *relatio* (document) of the Synod and prepares for the Church an 'Apostolic Exhortation' on these important matters. The smallest unit of the Church is the family — the 'Domestic Church' — and the holy basis of the family is Marriage. We should each be making sure that our families truly are 'domestic Churches', where the love of the Lord, prayer, and charity, are held in central place. In no better way can the Church grow than through the building up of holy, faithful families, who witness to the world the love of God and neighbour.

**THE MONTH OF THE HOLY ROSARY, OCTOBER**, is almost over now, but we must never tire of resorting to this most powerful prayer of the Church, invoking the intercession of Our Lady. The Rosary is a beautiful and simple meditation on the life of Our Lord, and Mary's participation in those holy mysteries. It is always special, for me, to have that chance — in May and October — to precede Sunday Masses with a decade of the Rosary, and I hope that it is an encouragement for you to use the Rosary more often in your daily lives, invoking Mary's prayers for all our many needs.

I will be away, briefly, for part of this week, so Mass will be celebrated on Tuesday and Wednesday mornings by Fr Michael Stewart. I thank him for his kindness in coming over here.

**May we pray for the grace to live our own family life in accordance with God's will. Fr Philip**

**From *Gaudium et Spes*, Vatican II on 'The Church in the Modern World,' n. 69:**

**VATICAN II,  
50 YEARS ON:  
THE NEW  
EVANGELIZATION**

God intended the earth with everything contained in it for the use of all human beings and peoples. ... In using them, therefore, man should regard the external things that he legitimately possesses not only as his own but also as common in the sense that they should be able to benefit not only him but also others. On the other hand, the right of having a share of earthly goods sufficient for oneself and one's family belongs to everyone. The Fathers and Doctors of the Church held this opinion, teaching that men are obliged to come to the relief of the poor and to do so not merely out of their superfluous goods. If one is in extreme necessity, he has the right to procure for himself what he needs out of the riches of others. Since there are so many people prostrate with hunger in the world, this sacred council urges all, both individuals and governments, to remember the aphorism of the Fathers, "Feed the man dying of hunger, because if you have not fed him, you have killed him," and really to share and employ their earthly goods, according to the ability of each, especially by supporting individuals or peoples with the aid by which they may be able to help and develop themselves.

## PRAYER & LITURGY

**ADORATION/MORNING PRAYER** will only take place on Monday morning next week. There will still be Mass at 9.15am as usual.

**MONTH OF THE ROSARY:** In October, Fr Philip will lead a decade of the Rosary five minutes before each Sat evening/Sunday Mass. The Rosary also prayed in Italian Thursdays at 7pm.

**WORLD MISSION SUNDAY** is a special day that unites Catholics all over the world in prayer, celebration and care for the family of the Church. Through *Missio*, the Holy Father invites all Catholics to contribute to this work. **The annual special collection will be taken this Sunday.**

**NOVEMBER LIST OF FAITHFUL DEPARTED:** Lists for you to write the names of your departed relatives and friends are now at the back of church. Please return the lists to the presbytery, along with any Mass offering. During November the lists will be kept on the altar and at least one Mass a day will be offered for the Holy Souls. Therefore, few other Mass intentions can be taken for November.

**PRAYERS AT THE CEMETERY:** Fr Philip will lead the annual visit to the cemetery to pray the Rosary for the deceased members of the parish on **Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> November**. Please meet inside the main gate at Ware Road at 3pm.

**LATIN MASS:** The monthly Latin Mass, with sung chants, will be held **next Sun 1<sup>st</sup> Nov** at 5.00pm.

**MASS FOR THE DECEASED OF THE PAST YEAR:** **Sat 14<sup>th</sup> November, 6.30pm Mass** will be a special Mass at which we remember and pray for the deceased of the past 12 months. Written invitations have been sent to the bereaved families of those whose funerals have been celebrated here in the parish, but all who have lost a dear one in the past year may wish to make their Sunday Mass that weekend. **Volunteers are needed to help with the refreshments in the crypt after Mass. If you can help, please contact the presbytery.**

**SUNDAY HOLY HOUR** (3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of each month) takes place at 5pm **Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> November** with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction.

**FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP:** 3<sup>rd</sup> Friday of each month, 7.30–8.30pm: **next meeting Nov 20<sup>th</sup>**. A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord. All welcome!

**ALTAR SERVERS:** Children (any age) who have at least made their First Holy Communion and wish to become altar servers, please contact the presbytery. We will arrange some training after half term.

**LITURGICAL ITEMS:** We are replacing the Processional Cross as it has been irreparably broken for some years, and we also need to replace the Holy Water container and purchase a Marian vestment. On the noticeboard is now posted the most recent summary of our parish's 'Growing in Faith' donations, which benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.**

As yet we have not sourced anyone to take up the post of a parish catechist, but Fr Philip is in discussion with friends in the diocese who have experience in this area, to try and find a recommended and suitably qualified person for the post. Do pray that this can come about soon.

## CATECHETICS

**FR PHILIP'S TALKS:** In the light of the present Synod on 'Marriage & The Family' at the Vatican, Fr Philip will give one more talk on Catholic Teaching on Wednesday evening at 8pm in church: (III) **11<sup>th</sup> November:** Why not Same-Sex 'Marriage'? On a table in the porch are many materials in connection with my talk series — both FREE paper handouts, and also a series of CTS booklets which are priced.

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME:** The second meeting for parents will be on **Wed 4<sup>th</sup> Nov 8–9pm** in the crypt. The second session for the children will be **Sat 7<sup>th</sup> Nov 10am–12noon**. **Please note a change of dates for June 2016: parents' meeting will be 8<sup>th</sup> June and the children's' meeting will be on 11<sup>th</sup> June.**

**CONFIRMATION 2016:** next session held on **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> November** from 7.15–8.45pm in the crypt for **parents and candidates**. Candidates will need to have read chapter five of the Gospel of Mark. **As mentioned in the parents' letter in July, the course has a £10 cost for materials, so please hand that in soon.**

**"RCIA"** – 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **The course continues on the 3<sup>rd</sup> November at 7pm.**

**BAPTISM COURSE:** The next course will be held on **Friday 13<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> November from 7.30–9pm** in the presbytery. The course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged. To enrol on the course, please contact the Presbytery.

**MARRIAGE PREPARATION COURSE:** There will be a course running from early February for engaged couples. If anyone is planning on marrying in 2016, please contact the presbytery as soon as possible. Please note you need to give at least 6 months' notice.
