ST AUGUSTINE – PARISH PATRON SAINT 28TH AUGUST 2016

Matthew 23: 8-12 The greatest among you must be your servant



OUR PATRONAL FEAST OF ST AUGUSTINE falls this Sunday, 28th August, and is obviously a great occasion for celebration! The image here (right) is a representation of the key moment in Augustine's life when, in a garden in Milan, Italy — far from his original home of Thagaste, Algeria — he was freed from his spiritual torments by a moment of intense grace from the Lord: he heard a little child's playful, sing-song repetition, "*Tolle, lege* ... *Tolle, lege*" ("Take, and read") ... and he took the chance to pick up his bible and read wherever his

eye chanced to fall. He read a passage of St Paul, and his heart was won over by the mercy of God, calling him away from a life of pride in his own achievements, and away too from a life of unchastity. This occurred in the autumn of 386AD, and then he set about receiving instruction and preparation for Baptism. St Ambrose, the archbishop of Milan baptized him at Easter 387, when St Augustine was nearly 33. He subsequently returned to North Africa, and in 397AD was ordained the bishop of Hippo, in modern-day Algeria, where he remained as bishop over 30yrs, until his death in 430AD.

As we keep our patronal feast, let's ask St Augustine's prayers for our own personal journey of conversion: may God break into our lives too with power to help us break patterns of sin, and give us that grace to see His hand at work in our daily lives, that we may rejoice in God whom St Augustine poetically described as "O beauty ever-ancient, ever-new."

May the Lord encourage us through the life, conversion, and prayers, of our patron! Fr Philip

From Misericordiae Vultus, Pope Francis on the 'Holy Year of Mercy,' n. 22:



A Jubilee also entails the granting of *indulgences*. This practice will acquire an even more important meaning in the Holy Year of Mercy. God's forgiveness knows no bounds. In the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God makes even more evident his love and its power to destroy all human sin. Reconciliation with God is made possible through the paschal mystery and the mediation of the Church. Thus God is always ready to forgive, and he never tires of forgiving in ways that are continually new and surprising. Nevertheless, all of us know

well the experience of sin. We know that we are called to perfection (cf. Mt 5:48), yet we feel the heavy burden of sin. Though we feel the transforming power of grace, we also feel the effects of sin typical of our fallen state. Despite being forgiven, the conflicting consequences of our sins remain. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, God forgives our sins, which he truly blots out; and yet sin leaves a negative effect on the way we think and act. But the mercy of God is stronger even than this. It becomes *indulgence* on the part of the Father who, through the Bride of Christ, his Church, reaches the pardoned sinner and frees him from every residue left by the consequences of sin, enabling him to act with charity, to grow in love rather than to fall back into sin.

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2017, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2017, then you will need to apply immediately to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2016. An information pack is available now from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.
