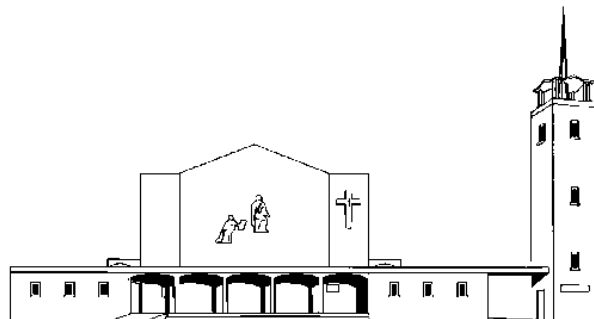

GOSPEL: The Passion according to St Luke.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

PALM SUNDAY TODAY MARKS THE START OF HOLY WEEK, and so we enter this most sacred of the weeks of Lent. I would like you to contemplate how you will give your ALL to Jesus in this Holy Week, and bring your Lenten practices to a powerful conclusion:

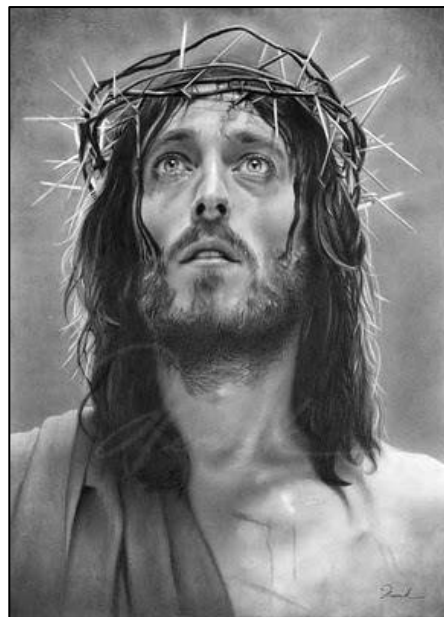
I. FASTING. Whatever else we have given up in Lent, we should make sure that this week on **Good Friday** we adhere to the command of the Church to abstain from all meat (those aged 14+) and keep a day of fasting (those aged 16–60).

II. ALMSGIVING. We could reflect on whether or not we have given anything substantial to charity this Lent. An ideal opportunity would be to make use of the '**Lenten Alms**' box at the front of church; or take an envelope, if you prefer, from alongside the Newsletters.

III. PRAYER. In Holy Week we have the pinnacle of the Church's liturgical life: the prayerful and moving ceremonies commemorating the Lord's Passion. PLEASE think of coming to the **WHOLE** of the **Easter Triduum** — especially if you have never done so before! **MAUNDY THURSDAY** 8pm Mass; **GOOD FRIDAY** 3pm Liturgy; **HOLY SATURDAY NIGHT** 9pm Easter Vigil. As well as the other opportunities for prayer, Stations of the Cross etc. All the times are listed inside ...

IV. RECONCILIATION. If you have not been to Confession, yet, this Lent, then please pray for the courage and humility to do so. The 'Holy Year of Mercy' urges us to take seriously the need we each have to kneel before the Father and receive His loving forgiveness. The best opportunity would be to come to one of the **PENITENTIAL SERVICES** on Monday (11.30am or 7.30pm) when several priests will be available for you after a brief preparation-service together. We can come to Easter in no better way than having had the sacramental forgiveness of our sins.

May we give this Holy Week generously to Jesus, accompanying Him in His Passion. Fr Philip



From *Misericordiae Vultus*, Pope Francis on the 'Holy Year of Mercy,' n. 9:



[The parables of mercy] contain profound teaching for all of us. Jesus affirms that mercy is not only an action of the Father, it becomes a criterion for ascertaining who his true children are. In short, we are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us. Pardoning offences becomes the clearest expression of merciful love, and for us Christians it is an imperative from which we cannot excuse ourselves. At times how hard it seems to forgive! And yet pardon is the instrument placed into our fragile hands to attain serenity of heart.

To let go of anger, wrath, violence, and revenge are necessary conditions to living joyfully. Let us therefore heed the Apostle's exhortation: "Do not let the sun go down on your anger." Above all, let us listen to the words of Jesus who made mercy an ideal of life and a criterion for the credibility of our faith, "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy": the beatitude to which we should particularly aspire in this Holy Year.

RECONCILIATION BEFORE EASTER

In addition to regular times for Confession, there will be additional availability of the Sacrament: **Penitential Services for the parish on Monday 21st March at 11.30am and 7.30pm. Several priests will be available on these occasions.**

Extra opportunities for Confessions this week:
After 9.15am Mass on Tuesday & Wednesday.
Holy Thursday: after Morning Prayer (9.15am) and before evening Mass 7pm–7.30pm.
Good Friday: after Stations of the Cross (10.45am) and before (2pm–2.30pm) and after 3pm Liturgy, and before evening Stations (6.30pm).
Holy Saturday: 10–11am.

Also there are other Penitential Services locally:
WALTHAM CROSS: Mon 21st March at 8pm

MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION, READERS & ALTAR SERVERS: If you can assist at any of the services during Holy Week, please sign your name on the lists at the back of the church.

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR (3rd Sunday of each month) takes place at 5pm **this Sunday 20th March** with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction.

MAUNDY THURSDAY MASS: In keeping with the symbolism of the washing of feet of the 12 apostles, 12 men/boys are required for the washing of feet. If you can take part, please sign your name on the list at the back of the church. **During the Mass, there will also be a Rite of Re-commissioning for the Ministers of Holy Communion so, if you are a Minister, please attend the Mass at 8pm.**

CHILDREN'S LITURGY ON GOOD FRIDAY: children should be taken straight to the crypt before 3pm. The children will be brought into the church to venerate the cross and have a blessing at Communion and should be collected from the crypt after the service.

GOOD FRIDAY ECUMENICAL WALK OF WITNESS: Please gather at **Aldi car park** from 10.30–10.45 to begin the walk at 11am.

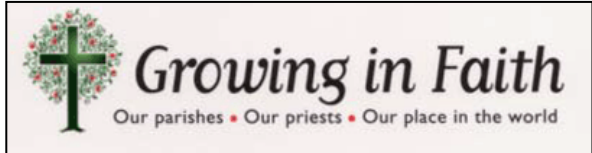

On the noticeboard is now posted the most recent summary of our parish's 'Growing in Faith' donations, which benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.**

As yet we have not sourced anyone to take up the post of a parish catechist, but Fr Philip is in discussion with friends in the diocese who have experience in this area, to try and find a recommended and suitably qualified person for the post. Do pray that this can come about soon.

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary

school in 2017, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2017, then you will need to apply immediately to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2016. An information pack is available now from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.
