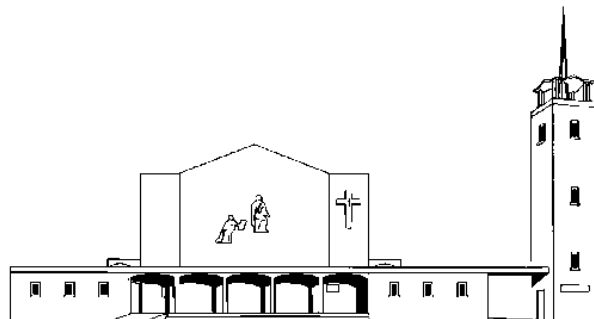

GOSPEL: John 20: 19–23

*As the Father sent me, so am I sending you: receive the Holy Spirit.*

**My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,**

**THE FINAL FEAST OF THE EASTER SEASON, PENTECOST,** is our great liturgical celebration today, as we recall the powerful moment when the Holy Spirit came down upon Our Lady and the apostles in Jerusalem. Our Lord had promised, before His Ascension, that they should stay in the city until they were “clothed with power from on high.” That great event took place at the Jewish feast of Pentecost, seven weeks after Passover; and hence,

for us, seven weeks after Easter. It brings to a close our seven weeks of Eastertide in a blaze of the Spirit's glory! Let us pray fervently on this feastday for the Holy Spirit to come to us anew.

**MY HOMILIES ON THE POPE'S APOSTOLIC EXHORTATION AMORIS LAETITIA** continue this week with a look at the 2<sup>nd</sup> Chapter of the document, ‘The Experiences and Challenges of Families.’ In this chapter the Pope explores many of the issues that face modern-day Catholic families in their trying to live out the faith. 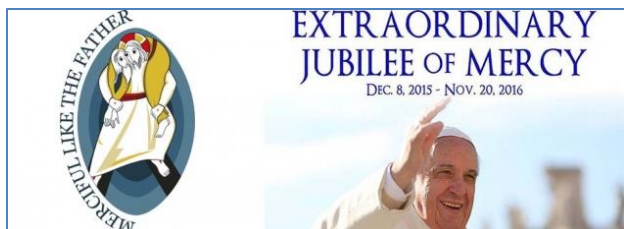

**From Misericordiae Vultus, Pope Francis on the ‘Holy Year of Mercy,’ n. 14:**



*Merciful like the Father* is the ‘motto’ of this Holy Year. In mercy, we find proof of how God loves us. He gives his entire self, always, freely, asking nothing in return. He comes to our aid whenever we call upon him. What a beautiful thing that the Church begins her daily prayer with the words, “O God, come to my assistance. ### CATECHETICS

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME:** The final meeting for parents will be on **Wednesday 8<sup>th</sup> June at 8pm**. The final session for children will be on **Saturday 11<sup>th</sup> June**.

**BAPTISM COURSE:** The second part of the course will be **held on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> May** from 7.30–9.00pm in the church.

**CONFIRMATION 2017:** Fr Philip wishes to see each candidate (in next year's year 9 or above) and a parent for a short chat (20–30 minutes) before the summer. **Applications will close for this programme on 8<sup>th</sup> July**. Please contact the presbytery for an appointment. In general, these will be between 3.30–6.00pm on the following days: 24<sup>th</sup> May, 7<sup>th</sup>, 14<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> June.



On the noticeboard is now posted the most recent summary of our parish's 'Growing in Faith' donations, which benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.**

As yet we have not sourced anyone to take up the post of a parish catechist, but Fr Philip is in discussion with friends in the diocese who have experience in this area, to try and find a recommended and suitably qualified person for the post. Do pray that this can come about soon.

### SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

**CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE:** If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2017, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2017, then you will need to apply immediately to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2016. An information pack is available now from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.

**GIFT AID:** We will soon be putting in a Gift Aid claim for the tax paid by parishioners on donations to the church in the year ending 5 April 2016. If you have signed a Gift-Aid form previously and are still paying UK tax, you do not need to take any action. If you are paying

enough UK tax and have not yet signed a Gift-Aid form you can still do so and it will apply to the previous year as well as future years. Provided you give by envelope or standing order this will enable the parish to reclaim 25p for every £1 you give at no extra cost to yourself. Gift-Aid forms are available beside the newsletters at the back of church. However, **if you have previously signed a Gift Aid form and have now stopped paying tax you will need to let the parish know.** If you have any queries or concerns about Gift Aid, please contact Bill Pollard, 461315.
