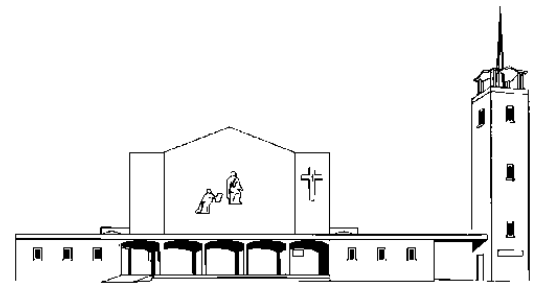

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

27<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER 2016

Matthew 24: 37-44 – *Stay awake so that you may be ready.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THIS WEEKEND WE JOYFULLY BEGIN OUR ADVENT SEASON, and we have these four lovely weeks in which to express the wonderful virtues of faith and hope. Advent – which means "coming" – expresses that profound hope, in the Church's liturgy, through a great *longing*. We long for the celebration of Christmas itself, Christ's birth at Bethlehem 2000 yrs ago; but we also long for Him to come again at the end of time, to bring all things to their right and just conclusion in accordance with His love and mercy. Let us enter wholeheartedly into this Advent spirit, and take some time to give this season over to the Lord, that he may renew in us our longing for Him, and a real hope.



As we start Advent, and maybe are thinking of Christmas cards and other purchases, we have our "**Milly's Charity Weekend**" fair in the Crypt after each of the Masses this weekend. It's named after a deceased parishioner, Milly Yarwood, who championed this charity sale in her inimitable and kindly way, and who died in 2009. So, after Mass this weekend, please come down to the Crypt for very special refreshments and browse round the stalls. The sign-in sheets for First Holy Communion and Confirmation will also be in the Crypt this weekend.

POPE FRANCIS CONCLUDED THE 'HOLY YEAR OF MERCY' last Sunday in Rome with the closing of the Holy Door at St Peter's basilica, and with the release of a beautiful Apostolic Letter *Misericordia et Misera* ("Mercy and Misery"). I will quote from this letter at the bottom of this Newsletter front page in the coming weeks as we reflect on what the Year of Mercy has meant and how we are to keep putting it into practice. One of the most obvious ways is to make our preparation carefully for Christmas by a good Confession. As well as at other times, there will be the Sacrament of Reconciliation available on **Monday 19<sup>th</sup> December at two Penitential Services** – 11.30am/7.30pm – so keep that date noted for this great opportunity for mercy! When we have received the Lord's mercy then we are more likely to be merciful to others!

May the Lord bless us with hope and holy longing as we await Christ's birth!

*MISERICORDIA ET MISERA* is a phrase used by Saint Augustine in recounting the story of Jesus' meeting with the woman taken in adultery. It would be difficult to imagine a more beautiful or apt way of expressing the mystery of God's love when it touches the sinner: "the two of them alone remained: *mercy with misery*." What great mercy and divine justice shine forth in this narrative! Its teaching serves not only to throw light on the conclusion of the Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, but also to point out the path that we are called to follow in the future.
