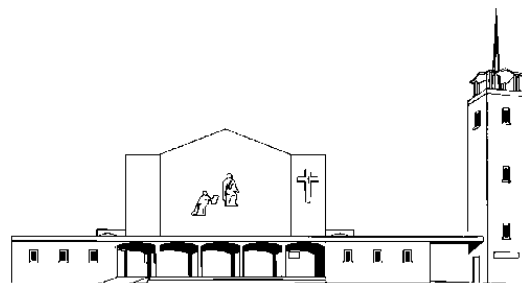

Luke 18: 1-8 — *God will see justice done to his chosen who cry to him.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE SPECIAL REQUIEM MASS FOR SR MARION — with the participation of all of St Cross School — is to take place this coming Friday. The details are inside the Newsletter, and I urge all of you who have known Sr Marion, in the parish or through her involvement as Teacher, and Head Teacher, at St Cross, to come and pray with us for her. It will be a beautiful expression of prayer and thanksgiving for this devoted religious sister who has given so much to our parish community, and especially to a generation or more of our parishioners when at school.

THERE ARE TWO PRO-LIFE CAMPAIGNS that I would like to draw your attention to at this time, both regarding the way our society and healthcare system screens the health of the unborn child. You may have seen recently the moving documentary by the actress Sally Phillips on the prejudiced way we treat those who have Down's Syndrome. If you haven't watched it yet, it's important that you take just 59 minutes of your time to do so — it's called "**A World Without Down's Syndrome?**" (link available from our parish FaceBook page): it's available on the BBC iPlayer for another 20 days.

The two campaigns which I would like you to pay some attention to are these:

(i) Linked to the recent documentary regarding more stringent screening for Down's Syndrome, there is the campaign "**Don't Screen us Out.**" <http://dontscreenusout.org/>



(ii) And second, regarding a new Bill in the Lord's brought by Lord Shinkwill, himself disabled: a campaign "**All are Equal,**" to reverse the horrific practice of aborting disabled babies right up to the age of birth. <http://allequal.org.uk/>



Both of these campaign pages have opportunities for you to e-mail our MP, Mr Charles Walker, to express your desire to see the reversal of discriminatory practices aimed at killing the unborn child.

WE WELCOME INTO THE CHURCH Alara Tranchina and Aliyah Leukes who will be baptised this weekend.

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR (3rd Sunday of each month) takes place at 5pm **this Sunday 16th Oct**, with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction. A truly peaceful hour!

MONDAY: There will be no Adoration or Morning Prayer, but there will be Mass at 9.15am as usual. Fr Philip has to attend a funeral in York this day.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY is next Sunday, a special day that unites Catholics all over the world in prayer, celebration and care for the family of the Church. Through *Missio*, the Holy Father invites all Catholics to contribute to this work. **The annual special collection will be taken the Sunday after, 30th October.**

REQUIEM MASS FOR SR MARION: this **Friday 21st October**, Mass will be offered for the repose of the soul of Sister Marion Connaughty, former Headteacher of St Cross. The whole school community will be attending the **Mass at 10.45am, which will replace the 12noon Mass this Friday.** St Cross schoolchildren will be involved in the readings, bidding prayers and music, as we pray for, and give thanks for, Sister Marion and the Sisters of Our Lady's legacy to St Cross school. All past pupils and families, staff and governors of St Cross are warmly invited to come to this Mass, along with current school families and friends. On return to school, after lunch there will be a celebratory afternoon where the children will remember the significance of the Sisters of Our Lady in the history of St Cross. There will be an 'open afternoon' so any visitors will be warmly welcome to come along to St Cross School. Teas and coffee will be available. We hope to see many of you there.

CATECHETICS

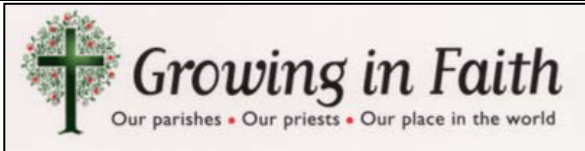

On the noticeboard is now posted the most recent summary of our parish's 'Growing in Faith' donations, which benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.** As yet we have not sourced anyone to take up the post of a parish catechist, but Fr Philip is in discussion with friends in the diocese who have experience in this area, to try and find a recommended and suitably qualified person for the post.
