

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

2nd APRIL 2017

John 11: 1-45 – *I am the resurrection and the life.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

ON THIS FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT, we hear the last of our three long Lenten Gospel chapters from St John: this week, ch. 11., recounting the raising of Jesus's friend Lazarus from the dead. This extraordinary miracle, performed at Bethany, only a few miles from Jerusalem, brought Jesus more to the attention of the authorities, and made them even more determined to have Him killed. For us, it shows the absolute power Jesus has over life & death, and points strongly towards His ultimate triumph over human mortality in the Resurrection.

WITH LENT NOW INTO ITS LAST TWO WEEKS, we should be asking ourselves how we have done so far in keeping our Lenten intentions. Our devotions and disciplines for Lent include: Fasting, Prayer & Almsgiving, along with a renewed Care for the Sick and an intention to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. May I offer some reminders in this regard, and to encourage you in this penultimate week of Lent to make special efforts to give generously to the Lord. **PRAYER:** there's the Stations of the Cross on Friday & Saturday this week; and the extra evening Mass on Friday (7.30pm). **FASTING:** how has your 'giving up' gone this year? – if not, then make a redoubled effort for these final two weeks. **ALMSGIVING:** why not consider giving generously to the 'East Africa Crisis Appeal' of the Disasters Emergency Committee, either online to our own Catholic Agency, CaFOD (<http://cafod.org.uk/>) or via the DEC itself (<https://www.dec.org.uk/appeal/east-africa-crisis-appeal>). **RECONCILIATION:** I will once again be offering to hear Confessions not only before the Sunday Masses, but also after ... and then there will be lots of others opportunities in Holy Week, most importantly the Penitential Services on Monday 10th April. Do take a look at the table in the porch which is full of good reading on preparing for Confession.


May the Lord bless our efforts in Lent to give this holy season to Him!

I would like us all to meditate upon the words of the Apostle, written towards the end of his life, when he confesses to Timothy that he was the greatest of sinners, "but for this reason I received mercy" (1 Tim 1:16). Paul's words, powerful as they are, make us reflect on our lives and see God's mercy at work in changing, converting and reforming our hearts. "I thank him who has given me strength for this, Christ Jesus our Lord, because he judged me faithful by appointing me to his service, though I formerly blasphemed and persecuted and insulted him. But I received mercy" (1 Tim 1:12-13).



PRAYER & LITURGY

FIRST FRIDAY: The first Friday Mass will be at 7.30pm on **Friday 7th April.** This will be followed by the Holy Hour at 8pm, which is always prayed for the pro-life cause.

MAUNDY THURSDAY MASS: In keeping with the symbolism of the washing of feet of the 12 apostles, 12 men or boys are required for the washing of feet. If you can take part, please sign your name on the list at the back of the church. **During the Mass, there will also be a Rite of Re-commissioning for the Ministers of Holy Communion so, if you are a Minister, please attend the Mass at 8pm.**

MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION, READERS & ALTAR SERVERS: If you can assist at any of the services during Holy Week, please sign your name on the lists at the back of the church.

FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP: 3rd Friday of each month, 7.30–8.30pm: **next meeting April 21st.** A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord.

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR will next take place on Sunday, **23rd April** at 5pm with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction. A truly peaceful hour!

ALTAR SERVERS: Children (any age) who have at least made their First Holy Communion and wish to become altar servers, please contact the presbytery. Training sessions will be held in the church on **Sat 13th and 20th May at 11am.**

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: the “Way of the Cross” prayed in church each Friday (12.30pm, after Mass), & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass.) And in Italian at 5.30pm each Friday.

PARISH “PENANCE” FOR LENT: In Lent, we will as usual have no final hymn at Sunday Mass, and then we will **keep silence** in the body of the church, so as to allow a period of prayer for those who wish to remain after Mass in Thanksgiving. Fr Philip will also go to the

Confessional at this time for anyone wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

LENTEN ALMS: This year the Cardinal has asked that the Lenten Alms be directed to the *Cardinal’s Appeal* fund. The funds raised will go to support parishes or groups in their work to further the mission of the Church: to serve the evangelisation of youth, to develop marriage and family life projects, and to provide service in society, especially to those on the margins. **You will find the box throughout Lent in front of the lectern.**

CONFIRMATION 2017: next session **24th April at 7.15pm** in the crypt for candidates.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: The 7th meeting for parents will be on **Wed 3rd May 8-9pm** in the crypt. The 7th session for children will be on **Mon 8th May 6-7.30pm**.



Our fundraising began in 2014, and **we have pledged of c. £185k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £51k.** So far we already have £24k available for our parish project, which is to employ a part-time worker in the area of catechetics and evangelization.

Fr Philip is meeting a possible candidate for this role, who has been recommended to us by the diocesan youth-ministry team. Let's pray that this will come to fruition!

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2018, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2018, then you need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2017. An information pack is available from the presbytery. Complete the form and return it to the presbytery, and your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after Saturday evening vigil Mass and Sunday Masses. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate.

You need to be a UK taxpayer to sign the declaration. If your circumstances change simply inform the Gift-Aid coordinator, Bill Pollard, to cancel the declaration.
