### SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

GOSPEL: John 20: 19-31 Eight days later, Jesus came.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

**OUR 7-WEEK SEASON OF EASTERTIDE began** last Sunday with a wonderful celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection Day. Thanks for all your assistance and contributions, across the parish, to making it a very happy Easter!

Today we continue to hear of Resurrection of Jesus, specifically appearances the appearance to 'doubting Thomas.' When this apostle - incredulous when he first heard

from the other apostles the news of Jesus's rising – saw Our Lord showing him the wounds of the Crucifixion, he fell to his knees and proclaimed, "My Lord and my God." He is a model for



our coming to believe: we too need to accept the evidence of the apostles; we too need to fall to our knees before Jesus and proclaim our total faith in Him: "My Lord and my God."

THIS SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER is also known as 'Divine Mercy' Sunday, after the devotion revealed to, and promoted by, Sr Faustina Kowalska (1905-1938) from her convent in Kraków, Poland. Pope St John Paul II determined that this Second Sunday of Eastertide be dedicated to our Lord's Divine Mercy. I have put out lots of the CTS booklets regarding the Divine Mercy in the porch, for you to buy if you wish, so as to keep the devotion. The motto of the Divine-Mercy devotion – "Jesus, I Trust in You" – connects strongly with St Thomas's words of faith.


May the Lord bless us as we celebrate these blessed weeks of Eastertide! Fr Philip

I wish to restate as firmly as I can that abortion is a grave sin, since it puts an end to an innocent life. In the same way, however, I can and must state that there is no sin that God's mercy cannot reach and wipe away when it finds a repentant heart

seeking to be reconciled with the Father. May every priest, therefore, be a guide, support and comfort to penitents on this journey of special reconciliation.

**LENT HUNGER LUNCHES**: The total raised for Christian Aid was £600 which included £29.00 for the sale of Easter cards. A huge


thank you to the speakers and the catering teams and to all who attended.
