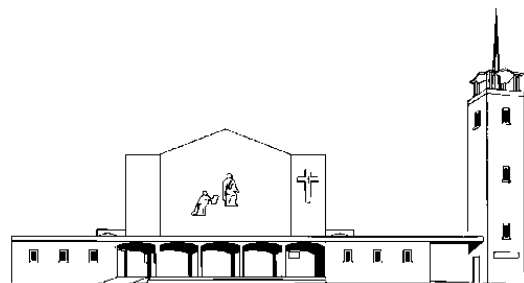

GOSPEL: Luke 24: 13-35

*They recognised him at the breaking of bread.*

**My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,**

ON THIS THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER, we hear the wonderful passage from St Luke's Gospel of the encounter with the Risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus. Understandably, the two disciples are downcast after the events of Good Friday, and as yet they have not heard of Jesus's Resurrection. It is at the point where Our Lord celebrates the Eucharist – makes Himself present with them as He "breaks the bread" – that their eyes are opened, and they realise that they have been walking the road, and hosting in their home, the Risen Lord Himself. No wonder they cast off their tiredness and despondency and return immediately along the 7-mile road all the way back to Jerusalem to share the news with the apostles and others. They show us the great joy that we have at the life-changing news of the Resurrection!



NEXT SUNDAY WILL SEE THE CONFIRMATION DAY FOR 41 OF OUR YOUNGER PARISHIONERS, so we keep them very much in our prayers as they approach their special day. Bishop Paul McAleenan, the auxiliary bishop in Hertfordshire, will be here to celebrate 2 Confirmation Masses, and we look forward to his presence here. May God bless these young people as they receive the gifts of the Holy Spirit for their life as disciples of the Lord.

WE WELCOME FR MATHEW KATTIYANGAL TO ST AUGUSTINE'S. Fr Mathew is from the diocese of Kottayam in Kerala, India, and has been appointed to serve as the national chaplain to the Knanayan community within the Syro-Malabar rite. He was ordained in 1989, and as well as serving in his diocese, spent 3 years of further study in Lugano, Switzerland, and 6 years of pastoral work in Los Angeles in the USA. Much of Fr Mathew's time will be spent across the country, in his work with the Knanayan community, but when he is here in Hoddesdon, please make him welcome and at home.

### SAINT OF THE WEEK

**Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May**  
**SS PHILIP & JAMES,**  
**Apostles**



Philip was one of the first chosen disciples of Christ. On the way from Judea to Galilee Our Lord found Philip and said, "Follow me." Philip obeyed, and then in his zeal and charity sought to win Nathaniel also, saying "We have found Him of whom Moses and the prophets wrote, Jesus of Nazareth." When Nathaniel in wonder asked, "Can any good come out of Nazareth?" Philip simply answered "Come and see" and brought him to Jesus. Saint James the Less (the Younger), author of the canonical Epistle, was the son of Alphaeus, the brother of Saint Jude and a cousin of Our Lord, whom he is said to have resembled. Saint Paul tells us that he was favoured by a special apparition of Christ after the Resurrection. (*1 Corinthians 15:7*) On the dispersion of the Apostles among the nations, Saint James remained as Bishop of Jerusalem, where the Jews held in such high veneration his purity, mortification, and prayer, that they named him *the Just*. He governed that church for 30 years before his martyrdom.
