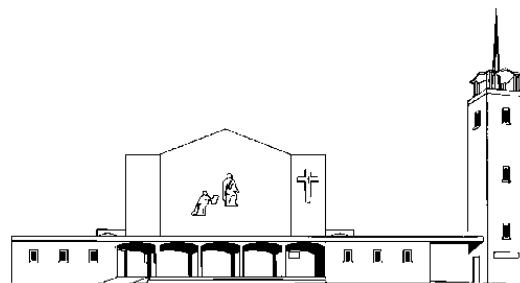

TWENTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

GOSPEL: Matthew 15: 21-28

Woman, you have great faith.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's, this 20th Sunday in ordinary time, we are called upon to pray persistently with great faith and our requests will be granted. Persistent praying never faints or grows weary. It is never discouraged. It never yields to cowardice, but is lifted up and sustained by a hope that knows no despair and a faith that will not let go. Persistent praying has patience to wait and strength to continue. It never prepares itself to quit praying, and it refuses to get up from its knees until an answer is received. We can learn a big lesson from the Canaanite woman in today's Gospel on persistent prayer. In this account, we see the Canaanite woman's journey of faith. Leaving her own religious tradition behind, she turns to a Jewish rabbi, Jesus, and places her faith in Him. She looks to Him for a miraculous cure for her daughter. For her trouble, she received silence from Jesus. She was rejected, humiliated, and given a cold shoulder from Him. She did not give up. The disciples of Jesus, annoyed by the fact that she was bothering Him with her loud crying, seek to get rid of her. They want Jesus to send her away. So Jesus says to her, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel." Even then she doesn't give up. The woman presses in on Jesus and falling on her knees in front of Him she cries out, "Lord help me." Jesus tells her, "It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs." How utterly humiliating. In effect, He was calling her a dog! Her humility was turned into what appeared to be a terrible humiliation. People in the Middle East are very sensitive to such things. But even then she does not give up. Now, in awful humility with her face in the dirt, stripped of her dignity, having abandoned her own religious background, she has nothing left, not even her pride. "Please, Lord," she softly insists, "even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters." What the Canaanite woman is saying is that she doesn't deserve anything, "but how about giving me scraps that accidentally fall from your abundance?" With that, the heart of Jesus is overwhelmed. "Woman you have great faith, let your wish be granted. And the request of the woman was granted. The lesson for us is that never to give up in prayer. If we ask the Lord with great faith and persistence our requests will always be granted.

It is the time of mercy because no sinner can ever tire of asking forgiveness and all can feel the welcoming embrace of the Father.

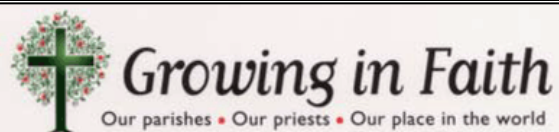

CATECHETICS

BAPTISM COURSE: The next course will be held on **Tues 12th & Fri 22nd Sept 7.30-9.00pm** in the presbytery. The course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged. To book onto the course, please contact the presbytery.

"**RCIA**" - 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **The course will begin on 11th September at 7pm.** If anyone is considering becoming a Catholic (or is an adult Catholic wishing to be confirmed,) please contact Fr Philip as soon as possible. Our fundraising began in 2014, and **we have pledged of c. £185k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £51k.** So far we already

have £24k available for our parish project, which is to employ a part-time worker in the area of catechetics and evangelization.

Fr Philip is meeting a possible candidate for this role, who has been recommended to us by the diocesan youth-ministry team. Let's pray that this will come to fruition!

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

ST AUGUSTINE'S UNDER 5s HOLIDAY TIMES: free play and themed activity days on **Mondays & Wednesdays 9.30am-11.30am.** Donation of £3 per child and £1 per sibling; under-1s free. This includes a drink and snack. Parents must be responsible for their children and must supervise them at all times.

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2018, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2018, then you need to continue signing the weekly sign-in-sheet in the church porch on the noticeboard. **Please note that the system for applying for a Certificate of Catholic Practice is now closed.**

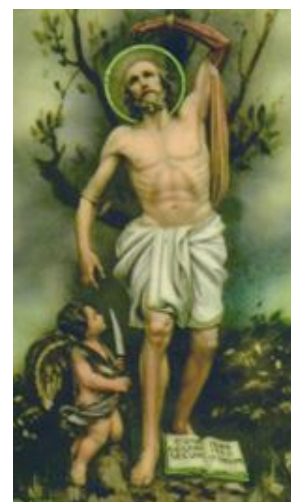

ST BARTHOLOMEW

24TH AUGUST

All that is known of him with certainty is that he is mentioned in the synoptic gospels and Acts as one of the twelve apostles. His name, a patronymic, means "son of Tolomai" and scholars believe he is the same as Nathanael mentioned in John, who says he is from Cana and that Jesus called him an "Israelite incapable of deceit." The Roman Martyrology says he preached in India and Greater Armenia, where he was flayed and beheaded by King Astyages.
