


SIXTH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR

Matthew 5: 17-37 – *You have learnt how it was said to our ancestors; but I say this to you.*

**My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,**

**OUR GOSPEL PASSAGE THIS SUNDAY** continues our excerpts from the great Sermon on the Mount. In today's passage, Our Lord deepens our understanding of how we are to keep the Commandments, expressing that we are not to keep them in a 'minimal' way, but in a far deeper, more considered way. One cannot just say, "I haven't killed anyone ..." – one has to extend one's self-examination to one's anger, one's aggression, one's tone of voice, one's choice of words to others, for example. Hearing Our Lord's words in the Sermon on the Mount is never easy: it can be unsettling, as we let them speak to our conscience. Let's allow His challenging words, uttered out of deep love for us, to penetrate our minds and hearts this Sunday!





**Pope Francis, from *Misericordia et Misera*, closing the 'Holy Year of Mercy,' n. 5:**



[At Mass] we are immersed in the great Eucharistic Prayer with the Preface that proclaims: "You so loved the world that in your mercy you sent us the Redeemer, to live like us in all things but sin." The Fourth Eucharistic Prayer is a hymn to God's mercy: "For you came in mercy to the aid of all, so that those who seek might find you." "Have mercy on us all" is the insistent plea made by the priest in the Eucharistic Prayer to implore a share in eternal life. After the *Our Father*, the priest continues by invoking peace and liberation from sin by the "aid of your mercy." And before the sign of peace, exchanged as an expression of fraternity and mutual love

in the light of forgiveness received, the priest prays: "Look not upon our sins but on the faith of your Church." In these words, with humble trust we beseech the gift of unity and peace for Holy Mother Church. The celebration of divine mercy culminates in the Eucharistic Sacrifice, the memorial of Christ's paschal mystery, the source of salvation for every human being, for history and for the whole world. In a word, each moment of the Eucharistic celebration refers to God's mercy.

## CATECHETICS

**NEXT BAPTISM COURSE** (2 sessions) will be on these dates: **Tues 14<sup>th</sup> March AND Fri 24<sup>th</sup> March, at 7.30pm**. A course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged. To enrol on the course, please contact the presbytery.

**CONFIRMATION 2017:** next session **20<sup>th</sup> Feb at 7.15-8.45pm** for **candidates and parents**. Candidates need to have read chs. 13 & 14 of the Mark's Gospel. In addition, over Half Term, the candidates are to research their **Confirmation saint's name**, and to fill in their "page 4" with a short account of that saint; also, to approach a **suitable sponsor** (a practising, Confirmed, Catholic), and to ask that person to fill in the Sponsor form.

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME:** The fifth meeting for parents will be on **Wed 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb 8-9pm** in the crypt. The fifth session for children will be on **Mon 27<sup>th</sup> Feb 6-7.30pm**.

**MARRIAGE PREPARATION:** couples are required by the Church to give at least SIX months' notice of an intention to marry, whether here or abroad. **A new course of Marriage Preparation will begin soon, probably in mid February**, and any couples intending to enter into the Sacrament of Marriage are invited to contact Fr Philip at their earliest convenience to discuss getting married. NO Marriage date or Venue Booking should be agreed on privately prior to seeing Fr Philip, as for all sorts of reasons that date may not be possible. Please contact Fr Philip first.

## SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

**CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE:** If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2018, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2018, then you will need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2017. An information pack is **available now** from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.
