

Matthew 5: 13-16 – *You are the light of the world.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

OUR GOSPEL PASSAGES FOR THESE SUNDAYS 'OF

ORDINARY TIME' continue to be drawn from

those key chapters of Matthew, 5-7, which

present the great body of teaching of Jesus

known as the 'Sermon on the Mount.' We heard

last week the opening passage of this, 'the

Beatitudes,' and now we continue to hear from

Jesus's teaching about the Kingdom as He uses

the two images for the Christian's presence in

society: "salt of the earth" and "light of the world."

I always think of these two images as

complementary: the 'salt' being an image for our

being distributed amongst the people of the

world, bringing a new "flavour" to society; and

the image of 'light' showing also that we *stand*

*out*, apart from the world, and act as a beacon

for guidance that can clearly be seen. If you

will, this is summed up in the phrase "*in* the

world but not *of* the world." The Lord places

us here as Christians to be living with others,

but not necessarily acting as others – instead,

to be examples of faith, hope and love. These

two images, then, are worth reflecting on as

we hear the Gospel today. Am I 'in' the world

enough – or too much? Do I act as 'salt to

the earth', making a truly Christian difference

to those around me as I take a committed

part in their lives, or do I hide myself away

from them? Am I 'of' the world too much,

or am I that beacon of 'light,' standing out

as a Christian should, in order to light the

way for others through life by my shining

example? Let's allow Our Lord's beautiful

images to come in to our hearts today at

Mass, and help us discern His will for our

ways of living as a Christian.



May we strive and pray to live out Jesus's teachings in our everyday life!

**Pope Francis, from *Misericordia et Misera*, closing the 'Holy Year of Mercy,' n. 5:**



First, we are called to *celebrate* mercy. What great richness is present in the Church's prayer when she invokes God as the Father of mercies! In the liturgy, mercy is not only repeatedly implored, but is truly received and experienced. From the beginning to the end of the Eucharistic celebration, mercy constantly appears in the dialogue between the assembly at prayer and the heart of the Father, who rejoices to bestow His merciful love. After first pleading for forgiveness with the invocation "Lord have mercy," we are immediately reassured: "May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and lead us to everlasting life." With this

confidence, the community gathers in the presence of the Lord, particularly on the holy day of the resurrection. Many of the 'Collect' prayers are meant to remind us of the great gift of mercy. In Lent, for example, we pray: "O God, author of every mercy and of all goodness, who in fasting, prayer and almsgiving have shown us a remedy for sin, look graciously on this confession of our lowliness, that we, who are bowed down by our conscience, may always be lifted up by Your mercy."

## CATECHETICS

**NEXT BAPTISM COURSE** (2 sessions) will be in March on these dates: **Tues 14<sup>th</sup> March AND Fri 24<sup>th</sup> March, at 7.30pm.** A course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged. To enrol on the course, please contact the presbytery.

**CONFIRMATION 2017:** next session **6<sup>th</sup> Feb at 7.15-8.45pm** for **candidates only.** Candidates need to have read chs 11 & 12 of the Mark's Gospel.

**FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME:** The fifth meeting for parents will be on **Wed 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb 8-9pm** in the crypt. The fifth session for children will be on **Mon 27<sup>th</sup> Feb 6-7.30pm.**

**MARRIAGE PREPARATION:** couples are required by the Church to give at least SIX months' notice of an intention to marry, whether here or abroad. **A new course of Marriage Preparation will begin soon, probably in mid February,** and any couples intending to enter into the Sacrament of Marriage are invited to contact Fr Philip at their earliest convenience to discuss getting married. NO Marriage date or Venue Booking should be agreed on privately prior to seeing Fr Philip, as for all sorts of reasons that date may not be possible. Please contact Fr Philip first.

### SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

**CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE:** If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2018, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2018, then you will need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2017. An information pack is **available now** from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to

the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.
