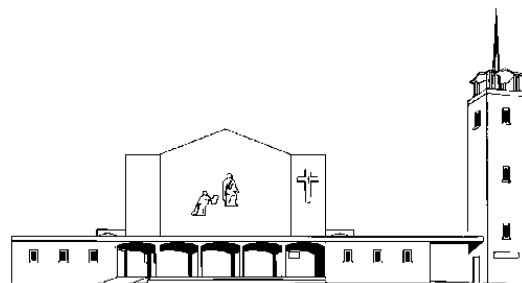

EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

8th JANUARY 2017

Matthew 2: 1-12 – *We saw His star and have come to do the king homage*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

A VERY HAPPY EPIPHANY TO YOU! This penultimate feast of the Christmas season brings much joy: the knowledge that Jesus was born not just as Messiah for the Jews, but as Saviour of all peoples! The Magi represent the outside world – the Gentile nations – coming to view and worship the new-born Son of God. So, in parts of the Church Epiphany is celebrated as a greater feast than Christmas, because it's when the news of Our Lord's birth became known. Hence the name, 'epiphany,' meaning 'manifestation': the Good News, the Gospel of 'God with us' is to be shared with all the world!

The gifts that the Magi bring are not the sort of regular gifts that a baby would expect to receive, but are "sacred gifts of mystic meaning": gold is for the Kings of kings; the incense is to honour Him as true God; the myrrh for anointing is a reminder of His early death and burial.

'THE BIG PICTURE' STARTS THIS TUESDAY 10TH JANUARY, a new series of evenings together to help us appreciate the beauty and richness of the Bible's message. Please take a flyer, and also sign up on the noticeboard, as there'll be a book & DVD pack provided for each participant, so we need to know (roughly) how many want to come along. It'll be a great series, so please think of coming along on Tuesday evening (crypt, 7.30pm): all welcome!

I SHALL BE ON PILGRIMAGE IN THE HOLY LAND THIS WEEK. I shall keep you all in my prayers as I visit the holy sites of Our Lord's birth, childhood, baptism, temptation, Galilean ministry, Jerusalem ministry, death and resurrection. My visit is a study retreat, with other Catholic clergy, to deepen our appreciation of the Scripture, and I pray that when I return I will be able to share some of what I have learnt through the homilies of the weeks to come.

May the Lord bless us in 2017 as we rejoice in the Good News of His birth!

Mercy is this concrete action of love that, by forgiving, transforms and changes our lives. In this way, the divine mystery of mercy is made manifest. God is merciful; His mercy lasts for ever. From generation to generation, it embraces all those who trust in Him and it changes them, by bestowing a share in His very life. What great joy welled up in the heart of these two women [in Jn 8 and Lk 7]. Forgiveness made them feel free at last and happy as never before. Their tears of shame and pain turned into the smile of a person who knows that he or she is loved. Mercy gives rise to *joy*, because our hearts are opened to the hope of a new life. The joy of

forgiveness is inexpressible, yet it radiates all around us whenever we experience forgiveness. Its source is in the love with which God comes to meet us, breaking through walls of selfishness that surround us, in order to make us in turn instruments of mercy.

CATECHETICS

ADULT CONFIRMATION COURSE: Tues evenings, concludes on **17th Jan 8-9.30pm**.

BAPTISM COURSE: the current course concludes on **Fri 27th Jan 2017 7.30-9.00pm** in the church. A course must be completed before a Baptism can be arranged.

CONFIRMATION 2017: The next session will be on **23rd Jan at 7.15-8.45pm** in the crypt for **candidates and parents**. Candidates will need to have read chapters 9 & 10 of the Gospel of Mark. The Enrolment Masses will be on the **7th/8th January** and will involve a simple statement of commitment to ongoing preparation. **We have slightly adjusted the times of the Confirmation Masses on the 7th May 2017 to 1.15pm and 4pm. However, the numbers for each Mass are very unbalanced. About 10 candidates need to swap from 1.15pm to 4pm.** If no one does this voluntarily, then we may have to use a ballot to decide on the allocation.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: The fourth meeting for parents will be on **Wed 18th Jan 8-9pm** in the crypt. The fourth session for children will be on **Mon 16th Jan 6-7.30pm**.



On the noticeboard is now posted the most recent summary of our parish's 'Growing in Faith' donations, which benefit both the diocese, and our own parish's project of employing a part-time catechetical co-ordinator. **We have raised pledges of c. £190k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £55k.** As yet we have not sourced anyone to take up the post of a parish catechist, but Fr Philip is in discussion with friends in the diocese who have experience in this area, to try and find a recommended and suitably qualified person for the post. Do pray that this can come about soon.

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

CATHOLIC PRIMARY SCHOOLS 2017: Applications are now open for both St Augustine's and St Cross Schools. **Deadline: 15th January.** Please ensure that you apply to

both schools as in total 60 Reception places are available. Application packs are available from the school offices.

ST AUGUSTINE'S SCHOOL: Miss Kousoulou will be conducting a final tour of the school on **Thursday 12th January at 11.45 am.** If there are any prospective families that would like to view Reception Class, please ring the school office. Telephone number 01992-463549.

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2018, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2018, then you will need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2017. An information pack is **available now** from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.
