

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

19th MARCH 2017

John 4: 5-42 – *The water that I shall give will turn into a spring of eternal life.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

ON THE THIRD, FOURTH & FIFTH SUNDAYS OF LENT in 'Year A,' we hear the great Lenten Gospel passages from the Gospel of St John: chapters 4, 9 & 11. These long passages treat the saving encounters of Our Lord Jesus with: the Samaritan Woman at the Well; the Man born Blind; and His friend Lazarus whom He raises from the Dead. These are opportunities to see how Jesus treats those who are sinners, those who are sick, and those who have died. In effect, He brings His saving grace most powerfully into their lives, and shows Himself to be the One and Only Saviour. As I said in last Sunday's homily, He brings us from sin to faith, from darkness to light, and from death to life – these are all central images of our Lenten journey together. So, let's be ready to listen carefully to these great Gospel passages, and to hear what divine wisdom Our Lord has to give in these lengthy dialogues. In a way, they should help us to focus on our drawing closer to Jesus in this season: what gets in the way of my closeness to Him? ... what do I need to change or repent of so as to be nearer to my Lord?



A SPECIAL EVENT THIS LENT is the Christian-themed concert of music for Lent & Easter that the 'Adoramus' choir is performing over the road at the 'Spotlight' Civic Centre on Saturday 1st April at 7.30pm; 'The Glory of Easter.' I really encourage you to attend, as I have met the man who organises these concerts, and he is very keen to make them events which truly announce the Gospel through the medium of beautiful music. In the *Sacrament of Forgiveness* God shows us the way to turn back to him and invites us to experience his closeness anew. This pardon can be obtained by beginning, first of all, to live in charity. The Apostle Peter tells us this when he writes that "love covers a multitude of sins." Only God forgives sins, but he asks that we be ready to forgive others even as he has forgiven us: "Forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us." How sad it is when our hearts are closed and unable to forgive! Resentment, anger and revenge gain the upper hand, making our lives miserable and blocking a joyful commitment to mercy.

## PRAYER & LITURGY

## LENT

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS:** the “Way of the Cross” prayed in church each Friday (12.30pm, after Mass), & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass.) And in Italian at 5.30pm each Friday.

**PARISH “PENANCE” FOR LENT:** In Lent, we will as usual have no final hymn at Sunday Mass, and then we will **keep silence** in the body of the church, so as to allow a period of prayer for those who wish to remain after Mass in Thanksgiving. Fr Philip will also go to the Confessional at this time for anyone wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

**LENTEN ALMS:** This year the Cardinal has asked that the Lenten Alms be directed to the Cardinal’s Appeal fund. The funds raised will go to support parishes or groups in their work to further the mission of the Church: to serve the evangelisation of youth, to develop marriage and family life projects, and to provide service in society, especially to those on the margins. **You will find the box throughout Lent in front of the lectern.**

**LENT LUNCHESES** will be held every Tuesday during Lent at Barclay Hall (St Catherine & St Paul’s Anglican church hall) at 12.15pm for £3. Profits to Christian Aid. Fr Philip will be the speaker on the **21<sup>st</sup> March**.

**HALF-DAY OF RECOLLECTION** will be held on **Saturday 1<sup>st</sup> April** starting with Mass at 10am and ending at 2pm in the crypt. Please do bring a packed lunch with you. All are welcome to attend.

‘**THE GLORY OF EASTER**’ will be performed by Adoramus choir and orchestra on **Sat 1<sup>st</sup> April** at 7.30pm at the Spotlight. Tickets £20, £18 or £16 available from the Spotlight box office 441946 or [www.adoramus.com](http://www.adoramus.com). This is a Christian choir, and is highly recommended.

Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.

If your circumstances change and you start to pay less or no tax, simply inform the Gift-Aid Coordinator, Bill Pollard, and the Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.
