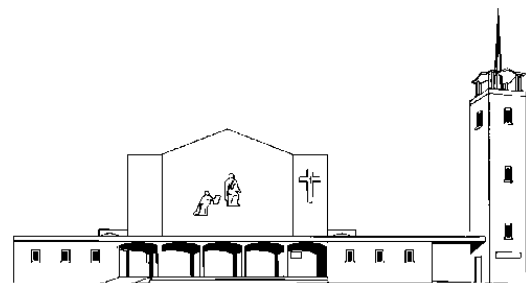

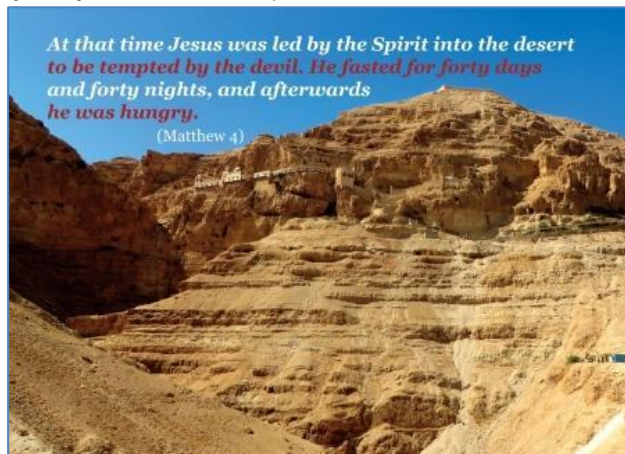
FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

5th MARCH 2017

Matthew 4: 1-11 – *Jesus fasts for forty days and is tempted.*

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

WE HAVE HAPPILY BEGUN LENT! – our beautiful season of preparation for the greatest feasts of the year, in 6 weeks' time, the commemoration of Jesus's Death and Resurrection. We begin Lent, as always, considering Our Lord's own 40 days' fasting and prayer in the Judaeen wilderness, which are the pattern for our 40 days of penitential practices in Lent. Our Lord's resistance to the devil's temptations to greed, despair and honour are countered strongly, and in our own lives are best resisted through the practices of fasting, prayer, and almsgiving. As I often say, "giving up" some things in Lent (i.e. fasting) helps us both to have more time (to pray) and more money (to give to charity): this is the great dynamic of Lent. Our Archbishop, Cardinal Vincent, added to our Lenten discipline, when he addressed us last week in his pastoral letter: to make sure that we visit the sick. So please reflect on that dimension of your daily Christian life, also, as you keep Lent this year. I really urge you to make good use of this season, and to take some bold and creative decisions as to how you will keep Lent. There are some obvious easy ways in which to give extra time to the Lord, in prayer, through **Daily Mass**; **Stations of the Cross** (Fri/Sat); **Friday Adoration** (11-12); **Holy Hour** (1st Friday, and 3rd Sunday, of the month); and in just popping in to the church for a few minutes whenever you pass, or park in the car park. Often, it's simple, regular acts of devotion, done with love, that make the most impact, long-term, in our spiritual lives.

May the Lord inspire us to begin our Lenten practices well, out of love for Him! Fr Philip

The *Bible* is the great story of the marvels of God's mercy. Every one of its pages is steeped in the love of the Father who from the moment of creation wished to impress the signs of his love on the universe. Through the words of the prophets and the wisdom writings, the Holy Spirit shaped the history of Israel as a recognition of God's closeness and love, despite the people's infidelity. Jesus's life and preaching decisively marked the history of the Christian community, which has viewed its mission in terms of Christ's command to be a permanent instrument of his mercy and forgiveness. Through Sacred Scripture, kept alive by the faith of the Church, the Lord continues to speak to his Bride, showing her the path she must take to enable the Gospel of salvation to reach all mankind. I greatly desire that God's word be increasingly celebrated, known and disseminated, so that the mystery of love streaming from this font of mercy may be ever better understood. As the Apostle tells us clearly: "All Scripture is inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness."

LENT

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: the “Way of the Cross” prayed in church each Friday (12.30pm, after Mass), & Saturday (9.30am, before Mass.) And in Italian at 5.30pm each Friday.

PARISH “PENANCE” FOR LENT: In Lent, we will as usual have no final hymn at Sunday Mass, and then we will **keep silence** in the body of the church, so as to allow a period of prayer for those who wish to remain after Mass in Thanksgiving. Fr Philip will also go to the Confessional at this time for anyone wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

LENTEN ALMS: This year the Cardinal has asked that the Lenten Alms be directed to the Cardinal’s Appeal fund. The funds raised will go to support parishes or groups in their work to further the mission of the Church: to serve the evangelisation of youth, to develop marriage and family life projects, and to provide service in society, especially to those on the margins. **You will find the box throughout Lent in front of the lectern.**

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2018, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2018, then you will need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2017. An information pack is **available now** from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be in a better position to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.
