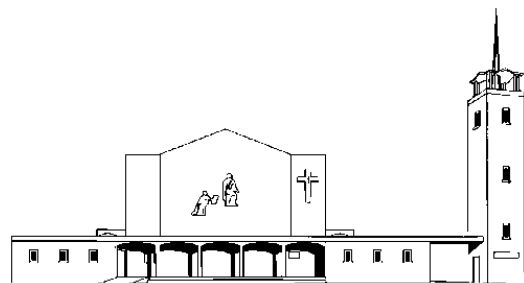

GOSPEL: Matthew 22: 15-21

Give back to Caesar what belongs to Caesar – and to God what belongs to God.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THIS WEEKEND OUR 'LOVE IN ACTION' THEME, the fifth in the series on Catholic Social Teaching, is 'The Dignity & Rights of Workers.' This consideration flows directly out of the previous theme of the Dignity of the Person, as work is a good and wholesome element of human existence. The Church taught in the Second Vatican Council of the dignity of work: "By his labour a man ordinarily supports himself and his family, is joined to his fellow

men and serves them, and can exercise genuine charity and be a partner in the work of bringing divine creation to perfection. Indeed, we hold that through labour offered to God man is associated with the redemptive work of Jesus Christ, who conferred an eminent dignity on labour when at Nazareth He worked with His own hands. From this there follows for every man the duty of working faithfully and also the right to work." At a time when there is much change afoot in the type of work available, its flexibility, and the effects of automation, the digital revolution, and the global nature of the economy, we have to maintain our concern for the right treatment of workers.

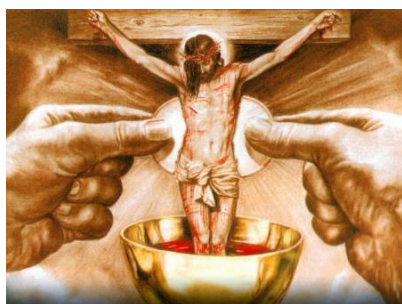

Preparing for the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, n. 5:



"*Mysterium fidei!* — The Mystery of Faith!" When the priest recites or chants these words, all present acclaim: "We announce your death, O Lord, and we proclaim your resurrection, until you come in glory". In these or similar words the Church, while pointing to Christ in the mystery of His passion, *also reveals her own mystery*. By the gift of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost the Church was born and set out upon the pathways of the world, yet a decisive moment in her taking shape was certainly the institution of the Eucharist in the Upper Room. Her foundation and wellspring is the whole *Triduum paschale*, but this is as it were gathered up, foreshadowed and 'concentrated' for ever in the gift of the Eucharist.

In this gift Jesus Christ entrusted to his Church the perennial making present of the paschal mystery. With it he brought about a mysterious "oneness in time" between that *Triduum* and the passage of the centuries.

PRAYER & LITURGY

WE WELCOME INTO THE CHURCH Mason Crowsley who will be baptised this weekend.

THE ROSARY: In October, the month of the Rosary, Fr Philip will lead one decade of the Rosary five minutes before each Saturday evening and Sunday Mass. The Rosary will be prayed in Italian on Thursdays at 7pm.

ADORATION/MORNING PRAYER will not take place on Tuesday & Wednesday whilst Fr Philip is away. **ALSO:** from now on there will be **Adoration on Saturdays 9.30-10am**, except in Lent when we have Stations of the Cross instead.

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR will next take place **Sunday, 19th Nov** at 5pm with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction. A truly peaceful hour!

FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP: 3rd Friday of each month, 7.30-8.30pm: **next meeting 17th Nov.** A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord.

WORLD MISSION SUNDAY is this Sunday, a special day that unites Catholics all over the world in prayer, celebration and care for the family of the Church. Through *Missio*, the Holy Father invites all Catholics to contribute to this work. The envelopes are attached to the newsletter. **The annual special collection will be taken the Sunday after, 29th October**
