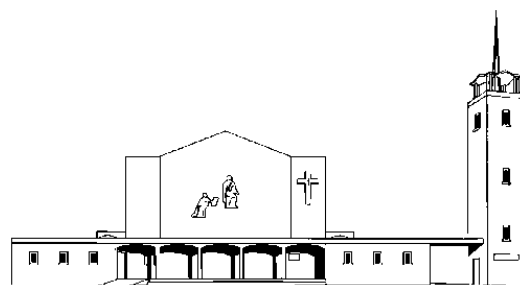

He must rise from the dead.

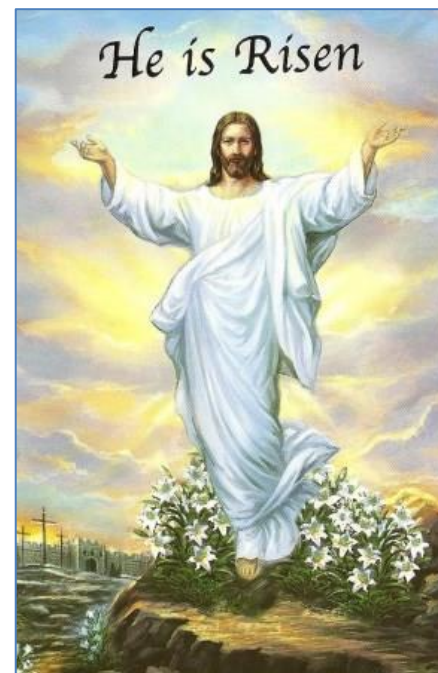
My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

A HAPPY & BLESSED EASTER TO YOU ALL! This most holy of all our feast days – the celebration of Our Lord's Resurrection – brings to its culmination the Holy Week we have just kept. The dates of Lent this year meant that Ash Wednesday fell on St Valentine's Day, and Easter Sunday falls on April Fools' Day, which is amusing and a bit bizarre. But Our Lord's Rising is no joke! It was no hoax, nor are we trying to fool anyone. Various disciples – starting with Mary Magdalene, and then later the apostles, and others – witnessed the Lord's risen presence: they saw Him, they conversed with Him, they were taught by Him, and then they saw Him ascend back to heaven. More than that, they gave their lives, to the shedding of their blood in martyrdom, many of them, attesting to the truth of the Resurrection of Jesus. This they would not have done had the whole thing been a fabrication. This means that we can truly entrust our whole life to Jesus, to following Him on the path of the Church that He has established: a way of faith that leads us without doubt to heavenly, eternal, risen life with Him.

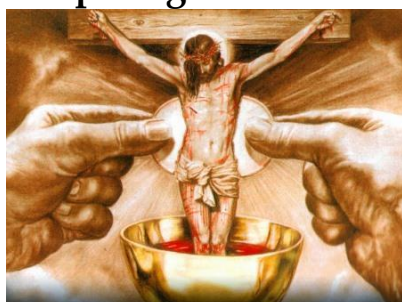

Preparing for the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 22:



By its union with Christ, the People of the New Covenant, ... becomes a 'sacrament' for humanity, a sign and instrument of the salvation achieved by Christ, the light of the world and the salt of the earth, for the redemption of all. The Church's mission stands in continuity with the mission of Christ: "As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." From the perpetuation of the sacrifice of the Cross and her communion with the body and blood of Christ in the Eucharist, the Church draws the spiritual power needed to carry out her mission. The Eucharist thus appears as both *the source* and *the summit* of all evangelization, since its goal is the communion of mankind with Christ and in him with the Father and the Holy Spirit.

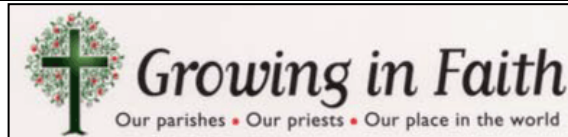
CATECHETICS

CONFIRMATION 2018: The next session will

be on **Tuesday 17th April 7.15pm** for candidates only. Please read chapters 15 & 16 of Mark's Gospel before the session.

"RCIA" – 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **The course continues on Monday 16th April.**

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME:
The next meeting for parents is on **Wed 25th April 8–9pm** in the crypt. The next session for children will be on **Mon 30th April, 6pm.**



Our fundraising began in 2014, and **we have pledged of c. £185k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £51k.** So far we already have £27k available for our parish project, which is to employ a part-time worker in the area of catechetics and evangelization.

Fr Philip is working with the diocese and seeking advice from other diocesan priests to draw up a job description to find the right person for this role.

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2019, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2019, then you will need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice' towards the end of 2018. An information pack is **available now** from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be able to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.

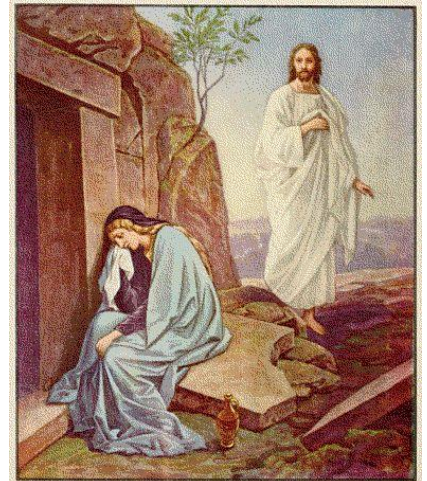

If you would like to start donating through the envelopes/standing orders, forms are available and members of the Finance Committee will be available to help. **GIFT AID** Many parishioners sign Gift-Aid forms, which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations made through envelopes/standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. You will need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a Gift-Aid form. **If your circumstances have changed and you pay less or no tax, please inform a.s.a.p. the Gift-Aid Coordinator, Bill Pollard, c/o The Presbytery, and your Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.**
