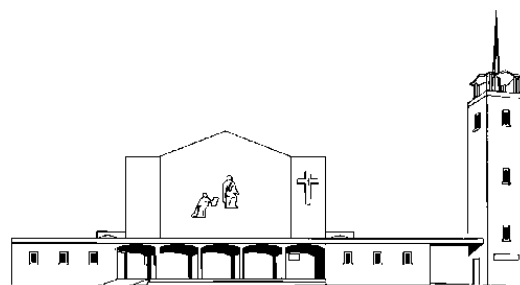

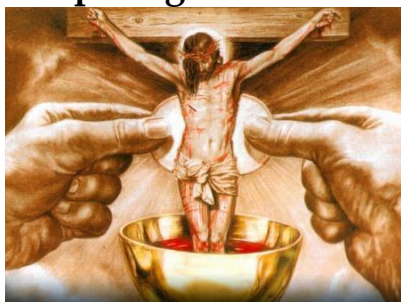
My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

A HAPPY LAETARE SUNDAY TO YOU! Happy Mothering Sunday! This mid-Lent point, celebrated with a slightly less penitential feel than the rest of Lent – hence the rose-pink vestments – is also traditionally in our country the opportunity to celebrate motherhood and to thank our mothers. Whether our mothers are alive with us, or whether they have been called by the Lord beyond this life, yet we honour them for their great sacrifices, and offer prayers for them this Mothering Sunday!

WE LOOK FORWARD NOW TO THE 2<sup>ND</sup> HALF OF LENT, and inserted in your Newsletter this week is the programme for the high-point of the season, namely the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week, the celebrations of Our Lord's Passion, Death, and Resurrection. As I said last week in the homily, we need to be prepared for this through the forgiveness of our sins in the **Sacrament Reconciliation**, and so a special date to keep in mind is the **Tuesday of Holy Week – 27<sup>th</sup> March** – when several priests will be here for you at our parish Penitential Service for Lent. Please attend this service in great numbers, as it will truly make the spiritual efforts of Lent complete: to come to Easter with hearts washed clean by Christ's divine forgiveness is the best possible use of our Lenten devotions and disciplines.

**May Christ drive out all that is unworthy of Him this Lent through our penance! Fr Philip**

**Preparing for the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 20:**



Many problems darken the horizon of our time. We need but think of the urgent need to work for peace, to base relationships between peoples on solid premises of justice and solidarity, and to defend human life from conception to its natural end. And what should we say of the thousand inconsistencies of a 'globalized' world where the weakest, the most powerless and the poorest appear to have so little hope! It is in this world that Christian hope must shine forth! For this reason too, the Lord wished to remain with us in the Eucharist, making his presence in meal and sacrifice the promise of a humanity renewed by his love. Significantly, in their account of the Last Supper, the Synoptics recount the institution of the Eucharist, while the Gospel of John relates, as a way of bringing out its profound meaning, the account of the 'washing of the feet,' in which Jesus appears as the teacher of communion and of service. The Apostle Paul, for his part, says that it is unworthy of a Christian community to partake of the Lord's Supper amid division and indifference towards the poor.

Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be able to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.

### SOCIAL & MISCELLANEOUS

**PLANNED GIVING:** Thank you to all parishioners who make regular donations with the weekly envelopes or through standing orders. **Boxes of envelopes for the new financial year will be available from the back of the church from this weekend.** If you would like to start donating through the envelopes/standing orders, forms will be available at the back of the church, and members of the Finance Committee will be available to help. **GIFT AID:** Please note that Gift-Aid forms will also be available. Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms, which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they have made through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. You will need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a Gift-Aid form. **If your circumstances have changed and you pay less or no tax, simply inform a.s.a.p. the Gift-Aid Coordinator, Bill Pollard, c/o The Presbytery, and your Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.**
