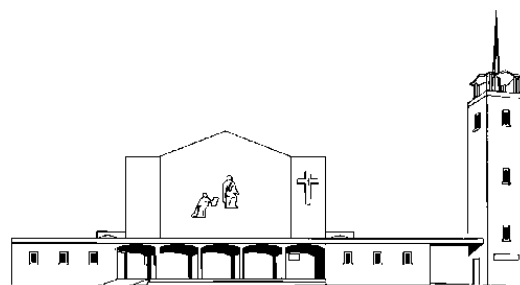

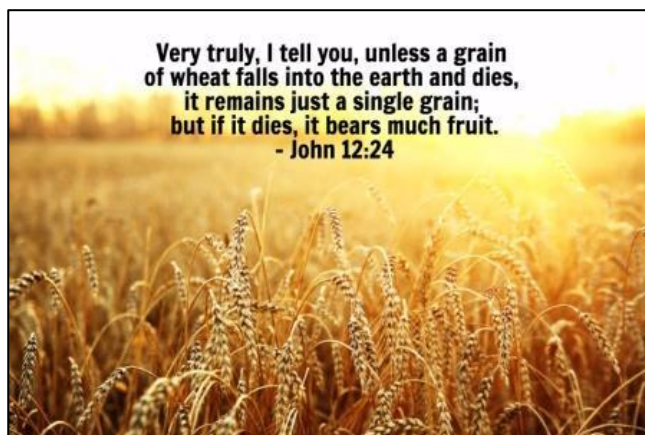

FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

18th MARCH 2018

GOSPEL: John 12:20-30

If a grain of wheat falls on the ground and dies, it yields a rich harvest.



My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

WITH THE FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT, TODAY, WE ENTER 'PASSIONTIDE' and we reflect more specifically on the sufferings of Our Lord Jesus as He approaches His saving sacrifice on Calvary. The crosses and statues are now covered, giving a more-sombre feel to the church's interior, and focussing our minds on the sorrowful events of Jesus's Passion. The Gospel passage from St John today prepares us for this, when Our Lord speaks of His death that is coming, but the Father affirms from heaven that this is also His glory. Jesus uses that image of the seed and the harvest: only the death of the seed in the ground can produce the 'resurrection' that is the harvest. His own death is to be life-giving for many. He offers up His own life so that we might live.

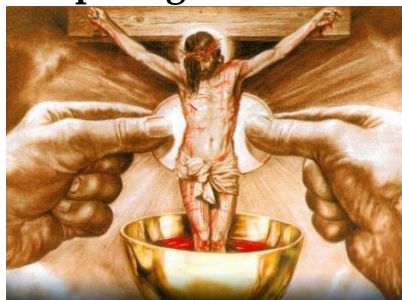
WITH REGARD TO THE LAST 2 WEEKS OF LENT, can I invite you warmly to the following events:

(i) **Lenten Half-Day of Recollection**, next Saturday (24th) from 10am Mass to 2pm. Fr Dominic Robinson, a Jesuit priest from Farm Street, will be coming to celebrate the Mass and lead us the reflections. Anyone and everyone invited – please just bring a packed lunch for the interval.

(ii) **Parish Penitential Service for Lent** on the Tuesday of Holy Week – 27th March – when about 6 priests will be here for you for the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. All our other Lenten disciplines point us towards Confession and the forgiveness of our sins by the merciful Lord. Let's make sure that we complete a good Lent with a grace-filled Confession.

May Christ drive out all that is unworthy of Him this Lent through our penance! Fr Philip

Preparing for the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 21:



The Evangelists specify that it was the Twelve, the Apostles, who gathered with Jesus at the Last Supper. This is a detail of notable importance, for the Apostles "were both the seeds of the new Israel and the beginning of the sacred hierarchy." By offering them his body and his blood as food, Christ mysteriously involved them in the sacrifice which would be completed later on Calvary. By analogy with the Covenant of Mount Sinai, sealed by sacrifice and the sprinkling of blood, the actions and words of Jesus at the Last Supper laid the foundations of the new messianic community, the People of the New Covenant. The Apostles, by accepting in the Upper Room Jesus's invitation: "Take, eat", "Drink of it, all of you," entered for the first time into sacramental communion with him. From that time forward, until the end of the age, the Church is built up through sacramental communion with the Son of God who was sacrificed for our sake: "Do this in remembrance of me ... Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

PRAYER & LITURGY

FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP: 3rd Friday of each month, 7.30–8.30pm: **next meeting 20th April.** A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord.

LENT

'WE ADORE YOU, O CHRIST, AND WE PRAISE YOU,' the diocesan booklet for Lent, focuses on our love of Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, the Mass, and our Mission. **Reflection group based on this booklet continues – Wednesdays 10.15am (after coffee).**

LENTEN ALMS are collected each year in support of charitable causes: this year for the *Cardinal's Lenten Appeal* which was set up in 2015 to fund innovative work of Catholic parishes, schools and charities working within the Diocese. It contributes to 3 fundamental mission areas of the Church: Marriage & Family Life, Evangelisation and the Church's Social Outreach. **You will find the box throughout Lent in front of the lectern.**

CATECHETICS

CONFIRMATION 2018: The next session will be on **Tuesday 27th March 7.15pm** for candidates and parents for the Penitential Service.

"RCIA" - 'Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults' is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **The course continues on Mon 19th March.**

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME: The next session for children will be on **Mon 19th March, 6pm. Owing to the last session having been cancelled, this session will finish at 8pm.** Next meeting for parents is on **Wed 25th April 8-9pm** in the crypt

FIRST-HOLY-COMMUNION LEAD CATECHIST: After many years, Vicky Lee-Lozone has now decided to finish in September. We are grateful to Vicky for her many years of hard work. A new head catechist is therefore needed. No experience is necessary as training will be given and you will be able to shadow Vicky until June. Our fundraising began in 2014, and we have **pledges of c. £185k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £51k.** So far we already have £27k available for our parish project, which is to employ a part-time worker in the area of catechetics and evangelization.

SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE: If your child is presently in year 5 and would wish to go to St Mary's or another Catholic secondary school in 2019, or if your child is looking to go into Reception year in a Catholic Primary school in autumn 2019, then you will need to apply **immediately** to go on the list for requesting a 'Certificate of Catholic Practice'

towards the end of 2018. An information pack is **available now** from the presbytery. Once you have completed the form and returned it to the presbytery, your name will be added to the weekly sign-in-sheet which will be available in the church porch on the noticeboard (by the fire-exit door) for signing after the Saturday evening vigil Mass and the Masses of Sunday. On this basis Fr Philip will be able to judge whether he can issue the Certificate you ask for.

SOCIAL & MISCELLANEOUS

CRYPT: We apologise for the ongoing disruption to the crypt kitchen. Unfortunately, damp has been found, preventing an immediate kitchen re-fit, and we are awaiting the damp-prevention work to be done. Thank you for your patience.

PLANNED GIVING: Boxes of envelopes for the new financial year are now available from the back of the church. If you would like to start donating through the envelopes/standing orders, forms will be available and members of the Finance Committee will be available to help. **GIFT AID** Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms, which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they have made through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. You will need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a Gift-Aid form. **If your circumstances have changed and you pay less or no tax, simply inform a.s.a.p. the Gift-Aid Coordinator, Bill Pollard, c/o The Presbytery, and your Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.**
