



GOSPEL: Mark 6: 1-6

*A prophet is only despised in his own country.*

**My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,**

OUR SUNDAY READING OF MARK'S GOSPEL brings us to the event of Our Lord's return to Nazareth, and His preaching in the home synagogue. They do not accept Him in His new role, and He is rejected already by those amongst whom He has grown up. Think in general what it means that Jesus suffered (and suffers!) the rejection of much of humanity – but think too what it means to Him to have been despised even by the people His home town! How sad it is that sinful mankind does not recognise its Saviour.



**Preparing for the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 35:**



The celebration of the Eucharist ... presupposes that communion already exists ... The sacrament is an expression of this bond of communion both in its *invisible* dimension, which, in Christ and through the working of the Holy Spirit, unites us to the Father and among ourselves, and in its *visible* dimension, which entails communion in the teaching of the Apostles, in the sacraments and in the Church's hierarchical order. The profound relationship between the invisible and the visible elements of ecclesial communion is constitutive of the Church as the sacrament of salvation. Only in this context can there be a legitimate celebration of the Eucharist and true participation in it. Consequently it is an intrinsic requirement of the Eucharist that it should be celebrated in communion, and specifically maintaining the various bonds of that communion intact.

**We have pledges of c. £185k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £51k.** So far we already have £29k available for our parish project, which is to employ a part-time worker in the area of catechetics and evangelization. Fr Philip is working with the diocese and seeking advice from other diocesan priests to draw up a job description to find the right person for this role.
