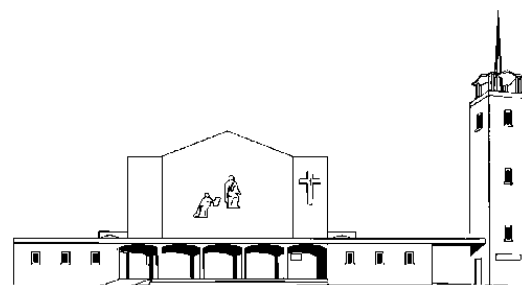

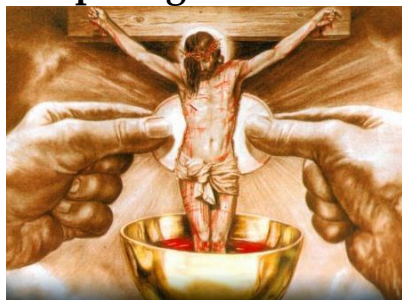

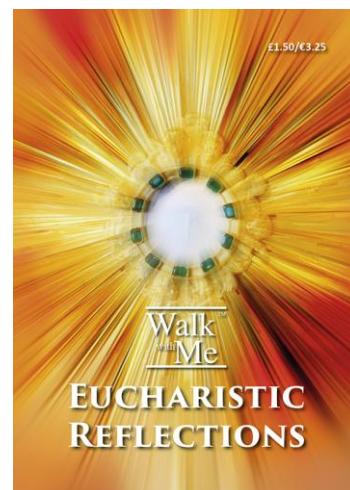

**Preparing for the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 47:**



Reading the account of the institution of the Eucharist in the Synoptic Gospels, we are struck by the simplicity and the 'solemnity' with which Jesus, on the evening of the Last Supper, instituted this great sacrament. There is an episode which in some way serves as its prelude: *the anointing at Bethany*. A woman, whom John identifies as Mary the sister of Lazarus, pours a flask of *costly ointment* over Jesus' head, which provokes from the disciples — and from Judas in particular — an indignant response, as if this act, in light of the needs of the poor, represented an intolerable "waste." But Jesus's own reaction is completely different. While

in no way detracting from the duty of charity towards the needy, for whom the disciples must always show special care — "the poor you will always have with you" — he looks towards his imminent death and burial, and sees this act of anointing as an anticipation of the honour which his body will continue to merit even after his death, indissolubly bound as it is to the mystery of his person.

## CATECHETICS

**BAPTISM COURSE:** The second part of the course will be held on **Fri 14<sup>th</sup> Sept from 7.30-9pm in the church.**

**CONFIRMATION 2019:** it was great to gather in July for the initial meeting of the new Confirmation group. Don’t forget to get copies of Baptism Certificates in to the Presbytery for those not baptized here at St Augustine’s. Next meeting: **Tues 4<sup>th</sup> September, 7-8.30pm.**

“**RCIA**” – ‘Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults’ is the programme for preparation for adults wishing to become Catholics, or be prepared for the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation and Holy Communion). **Course begins Mon 3<sup>rd</sup> September at 7pm.** If anyone is considering becoming a Catholic (or is an adult Catholic wishing to be confirmed,) please contact Fr Philip soon. ## SCHOOLS/UNDER-5s

**CERTIFICATE OF CATHOLIC PRACTICE:** those who have applied to be on the **Secondary Schools’ Signing Register,** please keep signing the weekly sign-in-sheet after the Saturday evening vigil Masses and the Masses of Sunday.

It is now no longer possible to apply to be added to the register for this year. **Both St Augustine's and St Cross Schools have now decided not to require the Certificate of Catholic Practice for September 2019 admission into Reception class. There will therefore be no Certificate of Catholic Practice issued this autumn for primary school.**



**We have pledges of c. £185k, to give our parish project, ultimately, a slice of c. £51k.** So far we already have £29k available for our parish project, which is to employ a part-time worker in the area of catechetics and evangelization.

Fr Philip is working with the diocese and seeking advice from other diocesan priests to draw up a job description to find the right person for this role.
