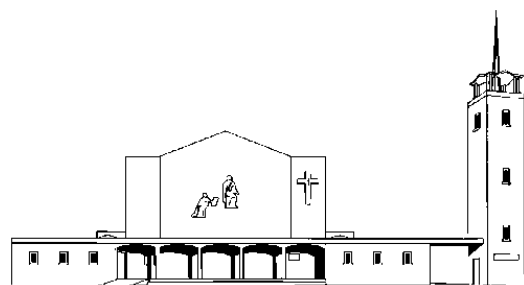

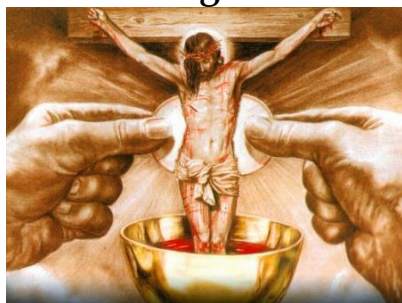

Celebrating the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 49:



[Church] architecture ... witnessed the transition, once the historical situation made it possible, from the first places of Eucharistic celebration in the *domus* or "homes" of Christian families to the solemn *basilicas* of the early centuries, to the imposing *cathedrals* of the Middle Ages, and to the *churches*, large and small, which gradually sprang up throughout the lands touched by Christianity. The designs of altars and tabernacles within Church interiors were often not simply motivated by artistic inspiration but also by a clear understanding of the mystery. The same could be said for *sacred music*, if we but think of the inspired Gregorian

melodies and the many, often great, composers who sought to do justice to the liturgical texts of the Mass. Similarly, can we overlook the enormous quantity of *artistic production*, ranging from fine craftsmanship to authentic works of art, in the area of Church furnishings and vestments used for the celebration of the Eucharist?

### CATECHETICS

### JUSTICE & PEACE AND PRO-LIFE

**CAFOD HARVEST DAY** is on **Friday 5<sup>th</sup> October** and the **Fast-Day envelopes will be attached to next weekend's newsletter and will also be collected next weekend.** CAFOD invites us to eat simply – perhaps having a bowl of soup instead of a meal – and give the money we save to help people from a remote village in Uganda.

**BROXBOURNE FOODBANK** is in *urgent* need of tinned fruit, tea bags 80's, dried pasta 500gms, UHT milk 1 litre and breakfast cereals. If you can donate, please use the box at the back of the church.

**BROXBOURNE WINTER NIGHT SHELTER:** There will be a parish volunteers' meeting in the crypt on **Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> October at 7.30pm**. There will also be first-aid training on Sat 27<sup>th</sup> October or Sat 10<sup>th</sup> Nov 9-1.30 at a local Red Cross centre which is optional but recommended. There will be a **full training meeting for all the volunteers** from across the borough for the 7 venues in November – date now released: **22<sup>nd</sup> Nov** (venue & time t.b.c.)

To enable the shelter to run, we need 12 of the following: duvets, duvet covers (singles), pillows, pillow cases and single sheets. Please note that they all need to be clean and good quality; bring what you can to the presbytery.
