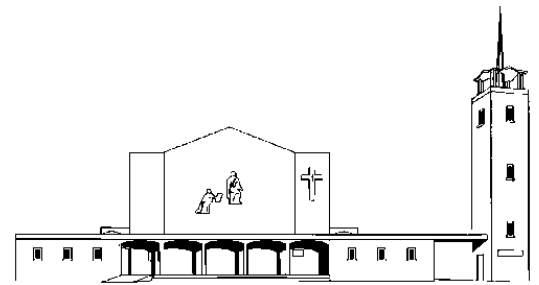

THE GOSPEL OF THIS SUNDAY urges us all not to prioritize our ambitions and our self-assertion, but to adopt a life of humble service. Our Lord reiterates that He Himself "did not come to be served, but to serve," and He upbraids the apostles James and John for their ambitious jockeying for position. Instead, He says, they should attend to their mission as humble servants of the Gospel, and be prepared even to give their very lives for Him.

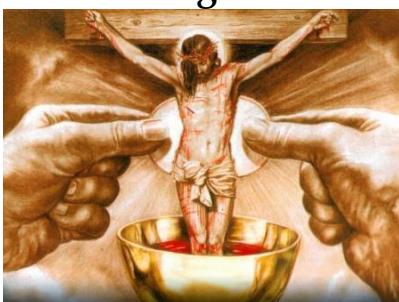

**Celebrating the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 52:**



[A] great responsibility ... belongs to priests in particular for the celebration of the Eucharist. ... I consider it my duty, therefore to appeal urgently that the liturgical norms for the celebration of the Eucharist be observed with great fidelity. ... Liturgy is never anyone's private property, be it of the celebrant or of the community in which the mysteries are celebrated. ... Priests who faithfully celebrate Mass according to the liturgical norms, and communities which conform to those norms, quietly but eloquently demonstrate their love for the Church. ... No one is permitted to undervalue the mystery entrusted to our hands: it is too great for anyone to feel free to treat it lightly and with disregard for its sacredness and its universality.
