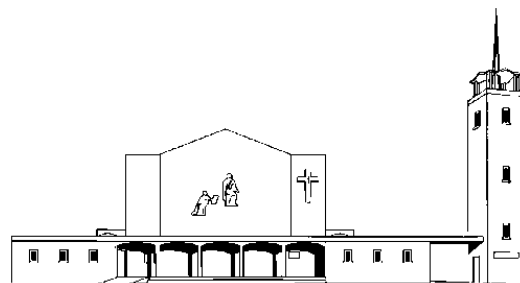

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

9th DECEMBER 2018

GOSPEL: Luke 3: 1-6

All mankind shall see the salvation of God.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

TODAY OUR SEASON OF ADVENT MOVES INTO ITS MIDDLE PHASE. The middle Sundays of Advent are a time to listen to the message of St

John the Baptist, appealing from the banks of the River Jordan, for his hearers to repent and return to the Lord. In connection with the Advent theme of the fulfilment of prophecy, the Gospel also makes it clear that John is the "voice crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the Way for the Lord!'" that Isaiah spoke of. St John the Baptist should really make us 'listen up' at this point of Advent, and to examine our lives and confess our sins in readiness for Christmas.

IN MY SERIES OF ADVENT-SUNDAY HOMILIES on the form of Scripture and the Liturgy of the Word at Mass, I'll make this Sunday a reflection on the Book of Psalms in the Old Testament. The Church uses the Psalms every day, not only at Mass but also in the Liturgy of the Divine Office (Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer etc.). These beautiful Jewish hymns, which Our Lord Jesus would Himself have prayed, are sung or recited continuously by the Christian faithful.

Please make sure that you have noted these dates for late Advent, in the days before Christmas:

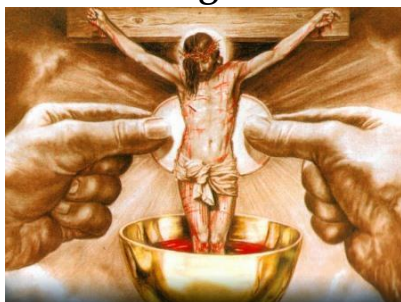
* 17th December (Monday) 11.30am & 7.30pm – PENITENTIAL SERVICES with Confession.

Celebrating the Eucharistic Congress 2018: John Paul II's *Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 58:



In the Eucharist the Church is completely united to Christ and his sacrifice, and makes her own the spirit of Mary. This truth can be understood more deeply by re-reading the *Magnificat* in a Eucharistic key. The Eucharist, like the Cantic of Mary, is first and foremost praise and thanksgiving. When Mary exclaims: "My soul magnifies the Lord and my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour", she already bears Jesus in her womb. She praises God "through" Jesus, but she also praises him "in" Jesus and "with" Jesus. This is itself the true "Eucharistic attitude." At the same time Mary recalls the wonders worked by God in salvation history in fulfilment of the promise once made to the fathers, and proclaims the wonder that surpasses them all, the redemptive incarnation. Lastly, the *Magnificat* reflects the eschatological tension of the Eucharist. Every time the Son of God comes again to us in the "poverty" of the sacramental signs of bread and wine, the seeds of that new history wherein the mighty are "put down from their thrones" and "those of low degree are exalted," take root in the world. ... The *Magnificat* expresses Mary's spirituality, and there is nothing greater than this spirituality for helping us to experience the mystery of the Eucharist. The Eucharist has been given to us so that our life, like that of Mary, may become completely a *Magnificat*!
