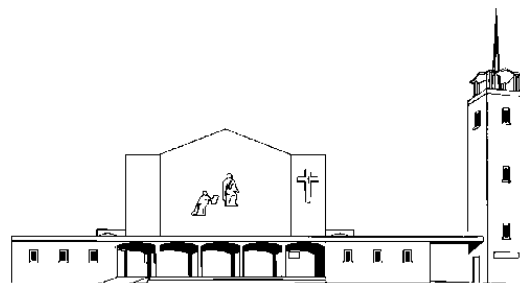

GOSPEL: Luke 4: 21-30

Like Elijah and Elisha, Jesus is not sent to the Jews only.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF OUR LORD (SAT 2ND) is the last of the celebrations connected with Christmas, and as it's an important feast we also keep it this Saturday evening at the 6.30pm Mass in place of the 4th-Sunday liturgy/readings. (For Saturday evening Mass, then, refer to the Mass books, p. 303 ff., and we'll start with the Blessing of Candles and Procession). It's a



beautiful occasion, as we recall the moment that Our Lord enters as a baby 'His Father's house' and is greeted by the saintly Simeon and Anna, both of whom have longed for the day of the Messiah's appearing. The aged Simeon utters his lovely canticle, the *Nunc Dimittis*, "Now Lord you can let Your servant depart in peace ... for my eyes have seen Your salvation ... The Light to enlighten the Gentiles, ..." We carry candles on Candlemas to represent this Light of Christ.

WEEKDAY MASS INTENTIONS ARE AVAILABLE in good numbers at this time for the coming weeks, so do consider having Mass offered for the intentions nearest to your heart. Mass can be offered for the living, or for the dead, for thanksgiving, for the sick, for the anniversaries of death, for the recently deceased, and for any holy intention (and if wished can be recorded as a 'private intention' if you wish not to make the intention public). Weekday Mass is a blessed way to spend a half hr each day in the company of Our Blessed Lord in His holy Sacrament.

THE WINTER NIGHT SHELTER continues smoothly across the seven host venues. May the patron saint of homeless people, St Joseph Benedict Labre, pray for our guests and our volunteers in this important project and expression of our Christian charity each Sunday evening here.

May the Lord Jesus – the Light of the World – bring light to our daily lives!

St Augustine teaches: Sermon for Catechumens on the Creed, 4:

We do not bring in two Gods as some do, who say, God the Father and God the Son, but greater God the Father and lesser God the Son. They both are what? Two Gods? You blush to speak it, blush to believe it. Lord God the Father, you say, and Lord God the Son: and the Son Himself says, 'No man can serve two Lords.' In His family shall we be in such wise, that, like as in a great house where there is the father of a family and he has a son, so we should say, the greater Lord, the lesser Lord? Shrink from such a thought. If you make to yourselves such like in your heart, you set up idols in the one soul. Utterly repel it. First believe, then understand. Now to whom God gives that when he has believed he soon understands; that is God's gift, not human frailness. Still, if you do not yet understand, believe: One God the Father, God Christ the Son of God. Both are what? One God.

HOUSE VISITS: Fr Philip will make his house visits on **Wed afternoon** this week to parish homes in Manor Rd, College Rd.

PARISH MAGAZINE is still available to buy for £5 from the back of church or from the presbytery.

GIFT AID: Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they have made through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor, but the

parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. During 2017/2018 we were able to claim over £11,800, and then received a further £2,000 through the 'gift aid small donation scheme.' If you are able to sign a Gift-Aid form, there are some on the notice board at the back of church, or you can contact the presbytery. You do need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a form.

MISSIO (RED BOX) MEMBERS: Fr Cosmas Ondari, a *Missio* priest aged 33, was shot and killed in the doorway of his church in Cameroon on the 8th December 2018. Please do remember him in your prayers. Ellen Bartlett.
