FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT

31st MARCH 2019

GOSPEL: Luke 15: 1-3, 11-32

Your brother here was dead and has come to life.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THIS IS LAETARE SUNDAY, THE FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT and the rose-pink vestments announce to us that we are midway through this sacred season of penance, prayer and preparation for the celebrations of Holy Week and Easter. It is a joyful moment – hence the "*Laetare,*" "Rejoice!" that comes through the liturgy of this midpoint of Lent.

The great parable of this Sunday's Mass – the 'Prodigal Son' – announces to us the immense joy of being reconciled to the Father as we seek the forgiveness of our sins. The set of parables of mercy in Lk 15 all announce that there is "great rejoicing in heaven" over the sinner that repents – so today we need to make the reflection on how and when we will seek God's holy forgiveness for our sins in the days between now and Easter. The inserted sheet available with today's Newsletter not only gives you the full set of Holy-Week services, but also gives you a chance to prepare for Confession, and lists the many opportunities, not only in this parish but also in other local parishes. Let us rejoice to know that the Lord is "full of tenderness and compassion, slow to anger and rich in graciousness."

A BLESSED AND HAPPY MOTHERING SUNDAY to all our parish mothers! *Laetare* Sunday is always, also, a chance to honour our mothers – with prayer and with a treat – and to ask God's blessing upon them for their great task of motherhood and of passing on the holy Catholic faith. We remember, too, with thanksgiving those mothers of ours who have died, and in God's great mercy we pray for their eternal salvation.

May the Lord Jesus – showing us His mercy – guide us to forgiveness this Lent! Fr Philip



St Augustine teaches: Sermon for Catechumens on the Creed, 10:

The end of the Lord we know. What end of the Lord? "My God, my God, why have You forsaken Me?" They are the words of the Lord hanging on the cross. He did as it were leave Him for present felicity, not leave Him for eternal immortality. In this is 'the end of the Lord.' The Jews hold Him, the Jews insult, the Jews bind Him, crown Him with thorns, dishonour Him with spitting, scourge Him, overwhelm Him with revilings, hang Him upon the tree, pierce Him with a spear, last of all bury Him. He was as it were left: but by whom? By those insulting ones. Therefore you shall but to this end have patience, that you may rise again and not die, that is, never die, even as Christ. For so we read, "Christ rising from the dead henceforth dies not."



PRAYER & LITURGY

ADORATION/MORNING PRAYER will not take place on Monday, but there will be Mass as usual at 9.15am.

If you can take part, please sign your name on the list at the back of the church. **During the Mass, there will also be a Rite of Re-commissioning for the Ministers of Holy Communion so, if you are a Minister, please attend the Mass at 8pm.**

FRIDAY PRAYER GROUP: 3rd Friday of each month, 7.30-8.30pm: **next meeting Friday 12th April**. A semi-formal hour in the Lady Chapel to reflect together on Sunday Scriptures and bring our needs and prayers to the Lord.

SUNDAY HOLY HOUR will next take place **Sunday 14th April at 5pm** with a Scriptural reflection, Adoration, Evening Prayer and Benediction. A truly peaceful hour!

PARISH ACCOUNTS: The income and expenditure for 2018 is now available to view on the noticeboard at the back of church.

PLANNED GIVING: Thank you to all parishioners who make regular donations with the weekly envelopes or through standing orders. **Boxes of envelopes for the new financial year will be available from the back of the church from this weekend.** If you would like to start donating through the envelopes/standing orders, forms will be available at the back of the church, and members of the Finance Committee will be available to help. **GIFT AID:** Please note that Gift-Aid forms will also be available. Many parishioners have already signed Gift-Aid forms, which enables the parish to collect the tax on the donations they have made through envelopes or standing orders. There is no further cost to the donor but the parish is able to claim another £1 for every £4 donated under Gift Aid. You will need to be a UK taxpayer to sign a Gift-Aid form. During 2017/2018 we were able to claim £11,800 and then received a further £2,000 through the gift-aid small-donations scheme. **If your circumstances have changed and you pay insufficient or no tax, simply inform a.s.a.p. the Presbytery, and your Gift-Aid declaration will be cancelled.**
