

GOSPEL: Luke 13: 22-30


Men from east and west will come to take their places at the feast in the kingdom of God.

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE GOSPEL PASSAGE FROM ST LUKE FOR THIS SUNDAY continues Our Lord's instructions for living a good and holy life. The Lord reminds us that we do not 'breeze' into heaven, but that the path to eternal life demands commitment and real focus. He uses the image of the 'narrow way' — the path that we need to stick to, and not stray from, if we are to come to eternal happiness. Jesus's whole concern for humanity is to prevent us from risking damnation. He urges us repeatedly to attend to our spiritual lives, which means attention to the Sacraments; to

weekly attendance at Sunday Mass; to the frequent use of Confession to unburden our souls of sin; and to the loving service of our neighbour, be he near or far.

THIS WEEK SEES OUR PARISH PATRONAL FEAST — ST AUGUSTINE'S DAY — which falls on Wednesday. His mother's feast (St Monica) is the day before, so we have a special week ahead with regard to these great saints. PLEASE, if you are able, come to Mass on St Augustine's Day at 9.15am, and if the weather is nice we will then take our tea & coffee & cakes in the parish garden.



THE PARISH BARBECUE (8TH SEPT) IS RAPIDLY APPROACHING, so PLEASE get your ticket requests in a.s.ap. My 20th Anniversary of ordination is also around this time, so the 11.15am Mass on the 8th Sept will be a special marking of that occasion, and then we can continue the celebration with the lunchtime barbecue. I would love it that lots of you come to celebrate this as a parish, and with me, so please take a ticket-request form, and get the forms back, if possible, this week.

St Augustine teaches: *On Patience, 16*

Here some man shall say; "If the concupiscence of the bad, whereby it comes that they bear all evils for that which they lust after, be of the world, how is it said to be of their will?" As if, truly, they were not themselves also of the world, when they love the world, forsaking Him by Whom the world was made. For they serve the creature more than the Creator, Who is blessed forever. Whether then by the word "world," the Apostle John signifies lovers of the world, the will, as it is of themselves, is therefore of the world: or whether under the name of the world he comprises heaven and earth, and all that is therein, that is the creature universally, it is plain that the will of the creature, not being that of the Creator, is of the world. For which cause to such the Lord says, "You are from beneath, I am from above: you are of this world, I am not of this world."


