GOSPEL: Luke 12: 13-21

This hoard of yours, whose will it be?

My Dear Parishioners of St Augustine's,

THE GOSPEL PASSAGE THIS SUNDAY cautions us on the riches of this world.

"What does it profit us to have gained the whole world, and to have lost or ruined our own self?" Vanity of vanities! "Our life is not made secure by what we own, even when we have more than we need." The rich man in the parable believed his future was secure, and that his good fortune was entirely due to his own merits. It must have come as a shock to learn that his life was God's to give and God's to take away.

We need to contemplate on this parable in depth; the rich man's fault was not in planning ahead. He was perfectly right to provide for his upkeep. Where he went wrong was in thinking only of himself, his own comfort and his wealth. Being rich is not bad, but the problem is when people become possessed by the riches and so much attached to the riches not acknowledging that all good things like riches and good health come from God. It is only when we live and work in some social solidarity that we fit in with God's plan for us with the spirit of sharing especially with our less privileged brothers and sisters.

"Seek first the Kingdom of God and the rest will fall in line." Keeping our treasure in heaven necessitates using all the opportunities for practical service that life puts into our hands. By giving ourselves in neighbourly service we "lay up treasure in heaven." Whatever we give to others in this way is not loss, but the kind of gain that really counts.

St Augustine teaches: On Patience, 12

Concerning true patience, worthy of the name of this virtue, whence it is to be had, must now be inquired. For there are some who attribute it to the strength of the human will, not which it has by Divine assistance, but which it has of free-will. Now this error is a proud one: for it is the error of them which abound, of whom it is said in the Psalm, "A scornful reproof to them which abound, and a despising to the proud." It is not therefore that "patience of the poor" which perishes not forever. For these poor receive it from that Rich One, to Whom is said, "My God are You, because my goods You need not." ... But these which abound, and disdain to be in want before God, lest they receive of Him true patience, they which glory in their own false patience, seek to "confound the counsel of the poor, because the Lord is his hope." Nor do they regard, seeing they are men, and attribute so much to their own, that is, to the human will, that they run into that which is written, "Cursed is everyone who puts his hope in man."

WESTMINSTER PILGRIMAGE TO WALSINGHAM, Saturday 21st September: as we prepare for the rededication of England to Our Lady as her dowry (March 2020), we have the chance to go on pilgrimage to Walsingham with Cardinal Vincent and Catholics from across the diocese this September. The Deanery coach will pick up at Hoddesdon at 7.15am, to get to Walsingham in good time for 12 noon Mass. After lunch we walk the Holy Mile and conclude with Benediction at the old Priory shrine. SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST LAWRENCE
10TH AUGUST

St. Lawrence, one of the deacons of the Roman Church, was one of the victims of the persecution of Valerian in 258, like Pope Sixtus II. At the beginning of the month of August, 258, the emperor issued an edict, commanding that all bishops, priests, and deacons should immediately be put to death. On 6 August Pope Sixtus II was apprehended in one of the catacombs, and executed forthwith. Four days later, on the 10th of August, Lawrence, also suffered a martyr’s death. St Ambrose relates that when St Lawrence was asked for the treasures of the church, he brought forward the poor, among whom he had divided the treasure, in place of alms; also that when Pope Sixtus II was led away to his death, he comforted Lawrence, who wished to share his martyrdom, by saying that he would follow him in three days. The saintly Bishop of Milan also states that St Lawrence was burned to death on a gridiron.
